Monthly Member Spotlight

This month's member spotlight is Art Sundberg, WW3ART.



Art has been living in Delaware since 1997 with his wife Deborah & married in 1966 while teaching navy submarine acoustics in Hawaii. They were both employed by General Dynamics, Electric Boat Division where he spent many days at sea onboard nuclear submarines or surface ships during acoustic sea trials. His previous electronics experience was obtained from RCA Institutes in New York City, a four year stint in the US Air Force in an electronics maintenance squadron in support of nav, comms and data links used by RC/EC-121 Radar Picket aircraft.

Art obtained his commercial FCC license in 1960 when it was called the 1st Class Radiotelephone Operator License (after 3rd & 2nd class) & converted to the FCC GROL in 1985. He used his training & interests while at the University of Delaware, College of Marine Studies-Marine Operations while supporting many faculty projects locally, the Caribbean, Costa Rica, Mexico, Hawaii. He obtained a USCG 100 ton near coastal captains license while running various research vessels and programs at UD. His responsibilities included installing & servicing the NOAA/National Weather Service, WE1 162.55MHz 1000w transmitter in Lewes.
