In today's Gospel Jesus visited the home of Simon and Andrew, his brother. Simon's mother-in-law was sick and they spoke to Him about her. With compassion, He healed her. As soon as she was healed, she got up, prepared a meal and served them. So, did Jesus heal her so she could do just that? Was Jesus simply hungry and needed free food? Was Peter missing his in-law's uniquely delicious dishes? Was that why he spoke to Jesus about her?

Well, we may never know the real answers to these questions, and they probably don't matter that much. For one, many grandmothers and in-laws who cook well, love to feed family members any chance they get. One important thing I gleaned from this passage is that Simon's mother-in-law seemed to enjoy serving Jesus and His bunch of followers. As soon as she was healed, without any excuses (she could have come up with many), she waited on them. I think that she did so more out of gratitude than anything else. I'd choose to serve others than to be sick like a dog any day!

So, the challenge and lesson for us here is to assess how we show our own gratitude for all the things God has done and continues to do for us. One way to show our gratitude is through service. How often do we hear of people who truly feel they have been blessed and want to give back to their community? That's social work. For those who believe in God, it's not social work, but works of faith and giving back to God Who has blessed us so much. So, how are you doing at giving back to God and your brothers and sisters out of gratitude?

One more point, this reading has a lot of personal touches to it, and I love it. I'm constantly inspired that Jesus was always visiting people's homes and eating with them. Apart from today's gospel, remember Mary and Martha, Lazarus' sisters and how Jesus frequented their home (Luke 10:38-42). Jesus was very close to the people He came to minister to. Again, that inspires my attitude to parish ministry. I believe in visiting each of you at home. I don't and won't mind how organized or disorganized, or how big or small your home is. I want to visit every family - and I mean every family. I can't heal your sick, but Jesus can, and together, we'll pray to Him. I can't solve your problems (maybe one or two), but we can talk about them and pray about them. I know I can offer encouragement, share your joys and sorrows, play with the kids and encourage them toward the right path, etc. And now that Fr. Anthony, our associate pastor, is here, I can do so even more. And he might love it, too. Again, each priest has his own gifts.

Blessings and God's healing love be with you. Amen.


OPENING OF THE 2016 MASS BOOK

OUR LADY OF LOURDES FEBRUARY 11TH



On December 8, 1854, Pope Pius IX proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception in the apostolic constitution *Ineffabilis Deus*. A little more than three years later, on February 11, 1858, a young lady appeared to Bernadette Soubirous. This began a series of visions. During the apparition on March 24, the lady identified herself with the words: "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Bernadette was a sickly child of poor parents. Their practice of the Catholic faith was scarcely more than lukewarm. Bernadette could pray the Our Father, the Hail Mary and the Creed. She also knew the prayer of the Miraculous Medal: "O Mary conceived without sin."

During interrogations Bernadette gave an account of what she saw. It was "something white in the shape of a girl." She used the word *aquero*, a dialect term meaning "this thing." It was "a pretty young girl with a rosary over her arm." Her white robe was encircled by a blue girdle. She wore a white veil. There was a yellow rose on each foot. A rosary was in her hand. Bernadette was also impressed that the lady did not use the informal form of address (*tu*), but the polite form (*vous*). The humble virgin appeared to a humble girl and treated her with dignity.

Through that humble girl, Mary revitalized and continues to revitalize the faith of millions of people. People began to flock to Lourdes from other parts of France and from all over the world. In 1862, church authorities confirmed the authenticity of the apparitions and authorized the cult of Our Lady of Lourdes for the diocese. The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes became worldwide in 1907.

COMMENT: Lourdes has become a place of pilgrimage and healing, but even more of faith. Church authorities have recognized over sixty miraculous cures, although there have probably been many more. To people of faith this is not surprising. It is a continuation of Jesus' healing miracles - now performed at the intercession of His mother.

Some would say that the greater miracles are hidden. Many who visit Lourdes return home with renewed faith and a readiness to serve God in their needy brothers and sisters. There still may be people who doubt the apparitions of Lourdes. Perhaps the best that can be said to them are the words that introduced the film, *Song of Bernadette*: "For those who believe in God, no explanation is necessary. For those who do not believe, no explanation is possible."
