## **Adult Day Care:**

Provides relief for families caring for a loved one with dementia or Alzheimer's. This service is available Monday through Thursday from 8:30 AM to 1:30 PM. Lunch and transportation are provided.

### **Congregate Meals:**

A hot lunch served at the Pickaway Senior Center at 11:30 AM on Monday, and at 12:00 noon Tuesday through Friday.

### **Homemakers:**

Assistance with cleaning, laundry and running errands.
Clients must meet certain eligibility criteria.

#### **Meals on Wheels:**

A hot lunch delivered to your home five days a week.

# National Family Caregiver Support Program:





### National Parks & Canyons of the Southwest Itinerary

#### Day 1: Arrive Las Vegas - Mesquite

Today fly to Las Vegas and meet your Tour Director. Enjoy a panoramic Las Vegas City Tour featuring the Old Downtown and the Las Vegas Strip.
