We are ready to hold the Carving Exhibit, all we need are *your* carvings to display at the Thames River Gallery at 239 Banks Street, New London, Connecticut.

The Sailfest information is on the website <u>Sailfest.org</u> and contains parking, shuttle, and event times.

Mystic Carvers, New England Woodcarvers, Inc and the Thames River Gallery on 239 Bank Street, New London, CT 06320, will partner to present an exhibit of wood carvings on July 7, 8, and 9.

Any carver from any level is welcome to exhibit any carving they choose! Just register on the website (link at bottom), and email a photo of your carving to Kimberly@NEWC.org

There are no categories; this is an exhibit not a contest. Everyone who registers will receive a frameable award certificate from NEWC, Sailfest, and The Thames River Gallery for their participation. Sailfest is visited by over 300,000 people. Bank Street and others will be closed to vehicle traffic so thousands of pedestrians can walk around and view all the venues. If you wish to sell any of your exhibited items, the Thames River Gallery will work with you to appraise and help you establish prices if you wish.

10 carvings will be awarded Best in Show by a Celebrity Judge Panel and 10 carvings will be awarded People's Choice Awards. Everyone will be recognized for their work. These awards will look great hanging in your workshop. All the proceeds from registrations will go the New England Woodcarvers, Inc. We need as many carvers as possible to enter!

Registration deadline is June 30th. Fees for registration are \$20 for first entry, \$15 Second entry, and \$10 for each additional entry. Fee for late entry after June 30th is \$30 per entry. In-person registration forms will be available at The Thames River Gallery the week before the exhibit if you cannot do the online registration.

Please consider dropping off your carving(s) early on Friday, July 7th or drop them off any day before the exhibit to avoid traffic and allow The Thames River Gallery staff time to set up the displays. You can pick up your carvings on Sunday, July 9th after 4:00 pm or come down any day after the exhibit to visit and pickup your caving(s) and awards.

## Woodcarvers Carving Exhibition outside Gallery

There will be *free carving space* outside The Thames River Gallery if you wish to visit and carve with us at Sailfest. A huge tent will be set up on the closed street outside, in front of the Gallery, where wood carvers may set up tables, demonstrate, display, and sell their work! Saturday will feature renowned carver, Christopher LaMontagne. Bring your own chair and tools and carve with other carvers while greeting

**visitors to the exhibit.** This will be a fun event and could be an annual event to exhibit our work and attract new members.

There are plenty of hotels in the area, but reservations should be made early to secure a room. Foxwoods is close by, and they have donated \$125,000 for the fireworks display on Saturday.

We need your support and participation to maintain and grow Woodcarving in our area! Thank you.

This is a note from John from the Thames River Gallery:

- 1. Dates for SAILFEST Saturday & Sunday 7/8 & 9
- 2. Time Saturday 10:00-5:00 & Sunday 10:00-4:00
- 3. Set-up time 8:00 9:00
- 4. Parking Muni lots behind the Gallery which the City of New London charges \$25.00 per day.

Ask Ed about other parking, he may know of more places.

- 5. We are providing tables and exhibitors should bring their own chairs or stools.
- 7. There are two options to display your work:

- A. You can exhibit your work on the table under the tent and sell it directly to the public. If you chose to do that, I would ask that you have a cash box and a receipt book. It looks more professional! Any sales made under the tent are NOT commissioned to the gallery.
- B. Any work that you would like to have exhibited and sold in the gallery would carry an 80% 20% commission with the 80% going to the artist. And please note that any work that is located in the gallery will be part of a juried competition.
- 8. Prizes for the juried competition are 1st place \$150.00, 2nd place \$75.00 and 3rd place \$50.00.
