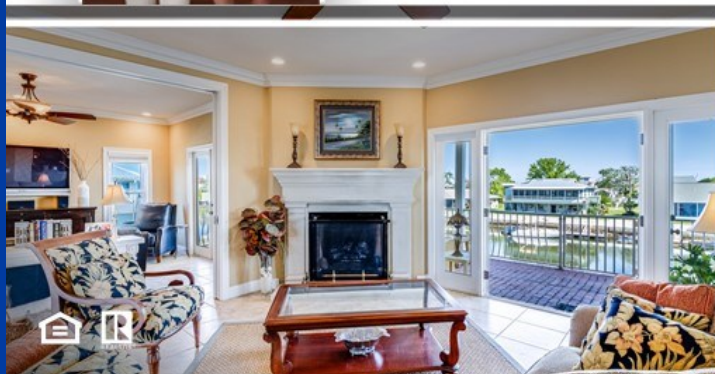

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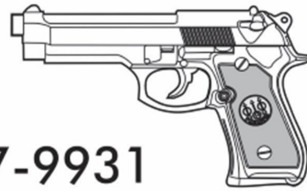

## THE FLORIDA SANDHILL CRANE (GRUS CANADENSIS PRATENSIS)

Sandhill cranes are tall, gray birds with a long neck and legs, and a bald spot of red skin on the top of its head. In flight, they extend their neck and head, making them different from herons, which tuck their neck in on their back. There are five subspecies of sandhill cranes (*Grus canadensis*) in North America. Only two

subspecies occur in Florida. Our resident sandhill crane (*G. c. pratensis*) is non-migratory and occurs throughout peninsular Florida. The other Florida subspecies (*G. C. tabida*) is a "snowbird" and migrates north.

The Florida sandhill crane is the smallest population of the five subspecies and is listed as **Threatened** on the Florida Endangered and Threatened Species List. The Florida sandhill crane can reach a height of almost 4', with a wingspan around 6 ½'.

Sandhill cranes are monogamous and thought to mate for life. Their distinctive, rattling calls can be heard from far away. The sexes appear identical except the male is slightly larger. They eat a variety of plants, insects, invertebrates, and small animals. They have one brood (1-3 eggs) per year; their young may remain with adults for ten months. Courtship dances in late winter and spring involve bounding 6-8 feet in the air with wings half-spread and calling loudly.

Unfortunately, like other wild animals, sandhill cranes evolved without vehicle traffic and many are killed by such every year. Their dull gray color and slow stride across roads and highways result in being hard to see, and they will not hurry nor react to honking horns. Other threats include habitat loss and heavy pesticide use in urban lawns - young sandhill cranes have died from pesticide poisoning. Please keep watch for, and be considerate of, these graceful, threatened birds, and help them survive.

## THE BRIEF 60(+) YEAR HISTORY OF HERNANDO BEACH

Last year, as part of some research I conducted for the Hernando County Port Authority, I came across among other things the original documents that Mr Sasser, the original developer of Hernando Beach had filed declaring his intentions to develop what us Floridans affectionally referred to as "Swamp Land" in the day. Today referred to as "wild life habitat" "marsh areas" and "protected areas". Back in the 1950's-1960's, the State of Florida was actively trying to populate the state. Remember WWII had just ended in 1945. If you think about it, even today, in excess of 50% of the state population lives within 15 miles of either the west or east coast. Of course, the original platte documents are limited in detail, given that this was a time before cell phones, the internet, Twitter, Facebook, etc. What did we do before all the electronic toys?

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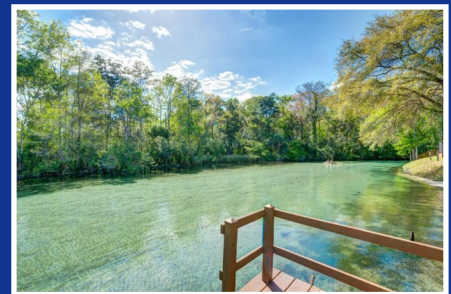
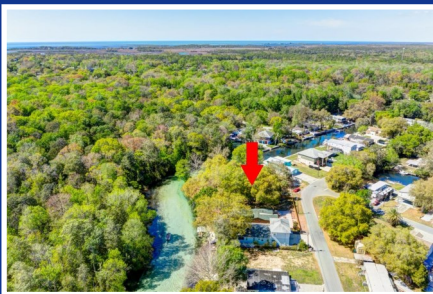
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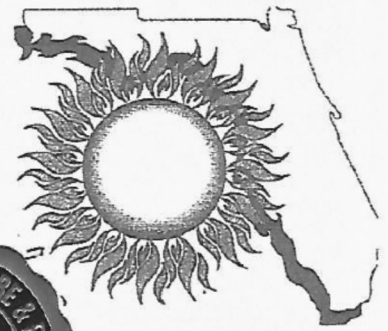

Mr Sasser's intent was to develop a premier residential community with covenants which included even prohibiting outside storage sheds. All went relatively well with his dredging efforts, and land sales up until about 1971. Remember this was life before conservation efforts, and the development regulations that exist today. Mr Sasser had completed most of the canals in Hernando Beach North as we know it to be today, and was about to start on what we now refer to as Hernando Beach Central and South. In 1970-1971, President Nixon signed into law what is referred to as the "Clean Water Act", which empowered the US Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) enforcement authority along with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) over wet lands and navigable waters. Remember the 1970's commercials on TV about the Cherokee Indian with a tear in his eye standing next to the Cuyahoga River showing the polluted river? This river pollution was a large impetus to enacting the Clean Water Act. The Cuyahoga River literally runs through the City of Cleveland Ohio, south from Lake Erie. The river was so polluted it actually caught fire during that time frame. I digress. Mr Sasser was threatened with Federal Legal action, if he did not change the concept of his development plan, which was originally going to provide full Gulf of Mexico access for all of Hernando Beach properties. Several years of litigation ensued in Federal Court, and what came out of that is what we have today. A dike around Hernando Beach South and the Boat Lift structure that provides connectivity between Hernando Beach Central to Hernando Beach North.

I ponder the point that Hernando Beach was originally intended to be a premier waterfront residential community. Key to recognize though, is that time has moved forward. Economic cycles in the real estate market have occurred and our community has become a more diverse -blended community with a commercial fishing component that has made a significant investment in the community. In the early days, a commercial fisherman that purchased a home in the area was allowed to dock their commercial vessels behind their home. Allowances are in place in the Hernando County Codes that even allow for that today, subject to some limitations. Florida really did not institute what we would consider the concept of master planning and zoning until the late 1960's. Today each county in the state must publish a comprehensive plan, that is submitted periodically to Tallahassee for approval. For those from the "Great White North", the watershed moment for master planning was when the Village of Euclid, Ohio argued in front of the Supreme Court of the United States that they had the right to institute Zoning Codes and requirements. Euclidian zoning has become the defacto standard, now implemented nationwide. That was circa 1926. Euclid, Ohio, is approximately 20 minutes west of Cleveland, Ohio on a good traffic day.

For background, Mr Sasser was a graduate of the University of Florida, holding degrees of Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and Juris Doctor. He served in

the Merchant Marines and the U.S. Army. He worked in private law practice and land development. He was the developer of the Hernando Beach, High Point, and Brookridge communities in Hernando County.

By today's standard's Florida is not "making any new waterfront property". Hernando County is growing and Hernando Beach has been discovered in my opinion. What a great opportunity for all our residents to come together to provide the best quality of life we can create for ourselves, and to be good stewards of our environment..... knowing the only constant in our society is change.


