# APPROVAL OF WORKER'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE RENEWAL

Craig McCutcheon, with McCutcheon Insurance Agency Ltd., explained the details of our worker's compensation renewal with Illinois Public Risk Fund. Our rates have remained the same as the current fiscal year; however, we will not be receiving 10% of the premium back (approximately \$30,000) because we have completed the HELP program, which allowed IPRF to look at our procedures and trainings to ensure safety practices were being taken.

Our policy also includes an indemnity and medical benefits deductible endorsement of \$25,000 per claim.

Craig Warning made a motion, seconded by Dennis Burkhardt to accept the Worker's Compensation insurance renewal, including the indemnity and medical benefits deductible endorsement, as presented. Motion passed with all ayes.

Craig Warning left the meeting at this time.

### TREASURER'S REPORT

Trustees Hennessy, Burkhardt and Warning congratulated Trustee Haas and Trustee Blank for their re-election to the Board at the April 6 election.

#### ASSISTANT CHIEF CAMPBELL'S REPORT

The 2021 Chevrolet Equinox was purchased on March 23 for \$24,074.00. The Mokena logo and lettering will be installed by Image 360 on April 15. This vehicle will be used by the Fire Marshal and will be housed at Station 1.

We will be going to Alexis Fire on April 19 to complete the final inspection on our new ambulance remount. If the ambulance passes the final inspection per the specifications, it will be delivered in approximately two weeks.

The new engine was delivered on March 29. There were two issues that needed to be repaired, including a leak in the top cover of the water tank and an inoperable rear arrow stick. The engine was brought to Macqueen Emergency for these repairs and is now back at Station 1. It is anticipated that the engine will be in service in May.

Truck 92 out of Station 2 had two front tires and four rear tires replaced by Pomp's Tires. Pomp's discovered that the rear axle shifted and the bolts that held the rear transverse torque arm together had sheared off. Chandler Services realigned the rear axle and replaced the bolts. As an extra layer of precaution, the truck was brought back

to Macqueen Emergency to have the repair inspected by the manufacturer. The truck is now back in service.

Truck 92 also had the front brakes replaced by Chandler Services.

Engine 93 out of Station 2 was out of service for approximately one week due to a rubber coupling leaking from the water tank to the pump. Due to the truck being out of service at the same time, we utilized the MABAS 19 IGA for apparatus sharing. This allowed us to borrow an engine from Frankfort FPD.

We responded to a house fire on March 22 on Jenyglenn Drive. The fire was contained to the bedroom on the second floor of the home. One family member was safely removed from the home; unfortunately, another resident died after she was taken to Silver Cross Hospital. The approximate value of damage to the home was \$100,000 and the approximate value saved was \$410,000. The approximate value of contents that was damaged was \$50,000 and the approximate value saved was \$100,000. An Effective Response Force analysis was presented.

The April training calendar was reviewed by the Board.

#### ASSISTANT CHIEF CIRELLI'S REPORT

This week is National Telecommunicators week. We appreciate all of the hard work that our dispatchers do to serve the public and keep us safe.

Much of the time spent this past month has been working on the budget for FY22. A draft budget will be presented at the May meeting.

We have begun testing and configuring the new data analysis system through Image Trend. It will take a few months before it is implemented.

We are working through the coordination and scheduling of a full-time testing consortium between Mokena, Frankfort, New Lenox, Homer Township, Manhattan and Peotone Fire Districts.

We have met with Resource Management Associates, the third-party testing agency, for the upcoming Lieutenant testing process to be held in July.

The Trustees reviewed the March code enforcement reports and the community risk reduction surveys.

#### CHIEF'S REPORT

The FY2021 ambulance billing data was reviewed.

Twelve Customer Satisfaction Surveys received in the past month were shared with the Board.
