



U.S. Economic Freedom Ain't What It Used to Be

The 2016 Index of Economic Freedom shows that the United States has climbed one notch from 12th place to 11th among the 186 nations of the world that were surveyed and rated. Time for celebration? Hardly.

The Index is an annual guide published by The Wall Street Journal and The Heritage Foundation, and it rates nations for labor freedom, business freedom and fiscal freedom. There are 10 different measures inside those three major groupings. Data used is from 2014.

The nations with more economic freedom than the U.S. are, starting with first place: Hong Kong, Singapore, New Zealand, Switzerland, Australia, Canada, Chile, Ireland, Estonia and the United Kingdom. Ranking 11th overall and second among the three North American nations, the U.S. "remains mired in the ranks of the 'mostly free,' the second-tier economic freedom status into which it dropped in 2010," the introduction to the report states. In seven of the past eight years Americans have seen their economic freedoms decline, and this year's score equals their country's worst score ever in the Index. At 75.4 out of 100 points, the U.S. has seen its score drop 0.9 since 2012, and from 80.7 since 2009.

In case you're wondering, Barack Obama took office in 2009. **Read more.**




