Grief Recovery Weekend

Are you, or someone you love, grieving the end of a marriage from a death, divorce or permanent separation? A *Beginning Experience Weekend* can help with the healing from such a loss. The next opportunity to attend one will be the weekend of March 10-12, 2017 in Milwaukie, near Clackamas Town Center.

The retreat consists of presentations by *Beginning Experience* team members, periods for private personal reflection and sharing in small groups. The weekend begins on Friday evening and concludes Sunday afternoon. The cost of \$195 includes lodging for 2 nights in a double room, meals and resource materials. Special arrangements may be made for payment, and partial scholarships are available. Single rooms may be reserved for an additional \$20.

FINANCE UPDATE

Finance Information 2016 and 2017

The Finance Committee would like to thank the congregation for their generous offerings during 2016. We were able to keep within our budget for 2016 and we did not have to use any of our reserve funds. Thank you to everyone for helping make this possible.

The 2017 budget has been set and has been approved by the Finance Team and will be brought up for approval to the Ministry Team. We look for our total revenue to be \$183,000. Our pledges and regular contributors make up approximately \$130,000, our auction/shared giving brings in \$12,900 and the cell tower rental brings in \$19,000. Again, thank you to our whole congregation for your efforts in helping to keep our church running well financially.

The generous gifts that are presented each week, month, or yearly help the church run efficiently. On the expenditure side of the budget 70% (\$130,000) goes to salary and benefits, \$26,480 goes to shared giving/apportionments, and \$24,000 goes to the running and maintenance of the office and building.

In addition to your pledges and regular contributions, there are other ways that you can help the church. When you are the last person out of the building be sure the lights are off and the heat or a/c is set to the appropriate temperature. Check with the office to see if any paper, stamps or materials are needed and donate them to the office. If you see water running, turn it off. If you see something that needs fixing check with the Trustees and then offer to help fix whatever is needed. Every person who attends Tualatin United Methodist helps to make it run efficiently and on budget. Thank you for your efforts.

COMMUNITY GARDEN UPDATE

With this winter weather upon us it is difficult to think about our garden, but spring is just around the corner! We hope.

Returning gardeners need to make their renewal commitment (verbal, e-mail, or written) by February 15. All gardeners need to fill out the renewal/application form and pay by March 1. Contact Debbie in the church office for a form.

The Hilltop Community Garden steering committee met in early January to begin preparations for another successful garden year. We have plans for soil amendments, building more trellises, compost bins, taking care of varmints, and sharing successes with plant varieties.

All church members, friends and family are invited to participate in the garden whether as gardeners (we do expect to have some family plots available this spring), harvesters (we pick Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings during the harvest season) or workers.

To inspire more of a sense of community as we maintain a successful garden, we're asking each of our gardeners to share in the work by participating in two work parties during the season. It will be a great opportunity to work side by side, get to know one another, and share garden stories. Church members are also welcome to pitch in to help during our work parties. These will begin in March with renewing all beds with fresh gardening soil, date to be announced.

In order to keep up with our water bill and general garden maintenance, fees will increase this year to \$30. Returning gardeners who cleaned out their bed in the fall or maintained a winter crop receive a discount to \$20. Payment along with the renewal/application form, should be sent to the church office.
