RE-OPENING UPDATE

After more than a year of meeting exclusively via Zoom, many people are now vaccinated and we are looking forward to being able to meet in person again. The Re-Opening Committee has announced plans for how our church will proceed in the next couple of months.

Some of the small groups in our church are now fully vaccinated. **Beginning April 25**, committees or classes that wish to meet in person may do so in the lounge, fellowship hall, or outside (with masks and distancing). Such groups will need to schedule these gatherings with the church office.

Beginning Sunday, May 9, we will have in-person worship outdoors in the front yard (weather allowing). These services will be shared on Zoom (hybrid worship). We will continue to wear masks and social distance. (All of our virus mitigation measures will be updates as time goes on.) Please bring a lawn chair to the outdoor services

(chairs will be available if you can't bring one). If weather does not allow us to meet outside, worship will be via Zoom only. If weather is a concern, we will make an announcement by Saturday evening as to whether we will be meeting outside.

By June, we expect that all adults can be vaccinated. **Beginning Sunday, June 4,** we plan to be back in the sanctuary for in-person worship (virus level in Story County allowing.) The services will continue to be shared on Zoom. We will wear masks and social distance.

In some ways the move back to the sanctuary will be a more difficult transition than the move to online worship, and we are still working out the many logistics necessary (communion, music, ushers, seating, offering, technology, sanitizing, how we might have fellowship time, when will nursery care be available, etc.) We will share more details in the coming weeks, including in the June *Spire*. It is clearly going to be a process.

I was recently in a Zoom alumni meeting with a seminary professor who lives in Florida. His seminary is in St. Louis and he teaches online. He also serves as pastor of an online-only church that has been in existence for a number of years—long before the recent surge in online church during the pandemic. This church has a few thousand people attending online each Sunday. Many people from outside the U.S. participate in the church because there are few if any church options for more progressive Christians where they live. It was kind of amazing to hear.

Technology allows us all kinds of creative approaches to ministry. We have learned through these past months that the most important thing technology has offered us is the chance for connection and community. I am so thankful that we have been able to stay connected over this long last year. I am so thankful for this community of faith and for each one of you. And I look forward to what unfolds in the days to come as we journey together with God, moving forward with the One who is always with us.







