March 1, 2020 First Sunday of lent Mt 4:1-11

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Happy Lent! Lent is a season of change of transformation, as we grow in our relationship to God and to God's People, the Church. It is a time to strengthen our witness as disciples following Jesus. So, we follow Jesus into the desert, to draw even closer to Him. He spent forty days in the desert. So, we also take up a 40-day change program. Like another year's 'spring training' (spring from death to life!), we take up the spiritual practices heard about in the gospel on Ash Wednesday: 1) increased prayer, 2) sacrificial fasting, and 3) charitable almsgiving (Matthew 6:1-21). These practices re-orient our lives away from our own selfish desires and pleasures and turn us toward God and God's people all around us. Let's start with prayer: this Lent, give extra time to reading scriptures, writing out some prayer-responses to God, attending daily mass (wonderful opportunity for lasting change), reading a spiritual book or keeping a daily meditation devotional. Then we have sacrificial fasting, as a way to let go of something that dominates our time, like a distracting phone or game, or a consuming hobby and pleasing luxury. And then we can reach out and help someone, offering your service and care by working for them without attachment to rewards or payoff. When these three spiritual practices are taken up together, we discover how each spiritual act builds upon the previous one to bring about a fulfilling change for good, for oneself and others. Such good work reveals the Holy Spirit of God working in you!

So, this type of good fruit and growth is what God has in store for everyone taking up Lenten practices of spiritual transformation. But hold on, this change will not come easily! Today's gospel reveals what the Devil, as a principle of decline and disorder, has in store for us, too. This story of the temptation of Jesus in the Desert (3x) always bothers me, because I figure that if the Devil is bold enough to tempt Jesus, then what about little old me? What am I to the Devil? Easy Pickings! Well, that should wake all of us up. As if our own lazy boredom and resistance to change are not two strikes against our changing for good in Lent, then we have a third fast-one coming at us from the Devil in the form of temptations. Maybe the Devil's first temptation of us will come in the form of the sly suggestion that 'Not this year, you are too busy, you can't changedon't even try'; then He will say 'you are just fine the way you are, your habits are not that bad' and then he will say 'oh, treat yourself, nobody is going to give you anything, please yourself'. If the Devil's voice is the only one we hear, then 'game over'! That is why it is crucial to put more scripture reading or daily mass or daily prayer into our routine. How do we ever 'hear' God if we don't give God time? Going into the desert allows us to turn off the buzz and static of daily noise. Such static noise usually just locks us into our own selfish routines. So, breaking those routines will open us to hear better God's voice, and enact new routines for spiritual change.

How does Jesus handle the temptations of the Devil? Each time, He quotes a response to the Devil from God's own Word. Jesus reveals the remedy. God's word is always on time, as an ever-ready response to temptation. Fittingly, His first response is to quote Deuteronomy 8:3 about God's Word feeding us. Then he quotes Deuteronomy 6:16, about not seeking showy displays of faith by 'putting the Lord God to the test'. And Jesus puts to rest the Devil's dare by quoting Deuteronomy 6:13, about being concerned only to 'serve the Lord God alone above all'. God's speech to us, His Voice, will guide us through all spiritual danger and distress. The Devil recognizes the power of God's Word, even trying to manipulate it to his destructive ends, by using Psalm 91:12 to seduce Jesus into glorifying Himself. Of course, that exposes the common abuse of using only a single verse of scripture out of context to justify human wishes (It is not enough to just be able to quote a bible verse, but we must understand its relation to the whole of scripture). All the more reason to keep our minds refreshed by God's word every day (sounds like a great practice to begin this Lent!). There are many daily devotionals that provide a daily reading plan of the bible. Pick up one of our available black books, the Word Among Us or Living Faith (Kids Version, too). Or there are great resources on the internet such as the Laudate App for iphone/ipad, or sites www.usccb.org/bible/readings/, www.ignatianspirituality.com/dotmagis-blog/, www.dynamiccatholic.com/best-

www.ignatianspirituality.com/dotmagis-blog/, www.dynamiccatholic.com/best-lent-ever, or Bishop Barron's www.lentreflections.com/ Our bulletin also lists the daily mass readings for you to pick up your own bible and follow along. Internet resources are great, easy to use, and so convenient, but beware of the other distractions that will fight for your attention in that phone or screen. A lot can be said about the good old version of a physical bible itself held in your hands as you read slowly and absorb the word without interrupting 'beeps' or 'pop-ups'!
