Enough is enough!.....a pastor's epistle

Sorry, I'm not in a position to declare the end of Winter and it is clear that King Boreas was not dethroned this year in our fair city. For the second time in my 5 years at St. Cecilia I made a decision last week to cancel liturgies on Sunday morning due to weather conditions. Feel free to question my judgment, wisdom or common sense. The full month of March is now in view and it is a good time to assess how, when and why we should cancel the central event of our communal life.

I'm sorry that word didn't reach those of you who arrived without getting the message. Our staff will be discussing our options and how to improve them when we meet this week. Folks are rightly protective of your personal contact information or may be unaware that we may or may not have accurate phone or email addresses. Many choose to attend without formally registering. As we sing, "All are welcome," but we need to find better ways to get news out to people.

We have been careful to limit our contacts with you. We have a weekly email "blast" with highlights of the upcoming activities. We have also used this list the few times we have sent emergency notices about closures. Theresa O'Toole likewise regularly communicates with families about Faith Formation news and she sent an email to her families who may not also be on our parish wide list. Jeanne used her phone and email lists to choir members and cantors. Not everyone has email or checks it. Understood. The email format, though, is the one we've chosen so far to deliver emergency messages. Folks have the option to opt-out of receiving these messages, but they may then miss the important, emergency messages.

We could purchase an additional feature that sends "robo-calls" (I hate receiving robo-calls!) or texts. We do not now have an up-to-date and comprehensive list of our parishioner's phone numbers be they land-lines or cell phones. All of these rely on our having current and complete information in our system.

After our next staff discussion we may reach out to you with an email survey to hear your communication preferences. We may invite you at that time to share/update your current contact information. I hope we'll get a good response!

Back to the particulars of my thought process last weekend. It seemed like we were experiencing what many call the "perfect storm" situation; I don't recall this combination of dangerously high winds, falling snow and temperatures in my recent/distant memory. It was not only an issue of my not being able to come in; the potential existed of folks who approach St. Cecilia from far and near, many who rely on uncleared highways, getting stuck or having to walk great distances on questionable surfaces while exposed to the harsh conditions. Public transportation is less frequent and reliable in such situations.

How can we alert people in time? What should we provide for those who do make it in? Marge walked up from her home to greet the small numbers of those who straggled in. She reported that folks didn't stay long. Some may have left to pursue other options. Some stopped in the church to pray for a moment before heading out again. She didn't feel there was a "critical mass" assembled there to gather for something like a simple communion service. We need now to discuss how we communicate cancellations, but also how to accommodate those who come anyway. Do let us know what you think, because we may be faced with the same challenges again before the Spring melt.

Archdiocesan Data Breach Notice

The Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis learned recently that hackers outside of the United States compromised an Image-I-Nation Technologies (INT) database that contained personal information on some employees and volunteers in the Archdiocese. INT is a vendor used by the company that conducts Archdiocesan background checks. Anyone affected was already sent an individual letter from INT with instructions to call the 800 number listed, others have no need to do anything.
