Every year at the POCI convention Pontiac historian John Sawruk-gives out 2 awards that he personally chooses the winners of. The two awards are most interesting Pre-war Pontiac and Most interesting Post-war Pontiac.

At the convention this year in creenville, SC, one of West Michigan's own Pontiac Enthusiasts graciously accepted the award for Most Interesting Post-War Pontiac. The Walker's latest addition to their stable of Pontiacs was the car of choice for this prestigious award. The car is Bob & Barb's mist blue 1966 Pontiac Laurentian.

At this point you might be asking yourself, What is a Pontiac Laurentian? The answer: it is the Canadian Pontiac version of the American Catalina. The Laurentian sits on a chevy chassis, but the body and interior are all Pontiac. It is a 2 door post coupe with body color wheels and the pmd poverty caps. Three hours, and 70 pounds later...we were on our way home to start baking and freezing. Scott says he still has blueberries coming out of his ears, but picking blueberries and the baking them up is one of my favorite summer things to do. I can't wait to go back next year!!

Here is a family favorite...

a recipe for those who also have so many blueberries, they don't know what to do with them:

Blueberry Coffee Cake

3 c. flour 1 1/8 c. sugar 6 tbsp margarine 3 3/4 tsp baking powder 1 tsp salt 1 1/8 c. milk 2 eggs 3 c. blueberries

Topping: 3/4 cup sugar 1/2 cup flour 3/4 tsp cinnamon 5 Tbsp margarine

Heat oven to 375 degrees and grease 9x13 pan. Blend together first amounts of flour, sugar and margarine. Add baking powder, salt, milk and eggs. Beat vigorously for 30 seconds. Carefully stir in blueberries. Spread in pan. In another bowl, combine topping ingredients. Cut together until orumbly and sprinkle over batter. Bake about 50 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Drizzle with powdered sugar icing (mix a little warm milk with powdered sugar). **Other fruit may be substituted** ENJOY!!
