Freight are still above average and trucks are limited. Mexico is still experiencing a fuel shortage. This could affect imports in the coming weeks.

WEATHER



Southeast: Mostly warm weather with cool nights, high chance of rain

Salinas: Cool days with cold nights, cloudy throughout the week

Coachella: Hot days and cooler nights, partly cloudy most of the week

CROP REPORT



Apples – Good quality on all varieties. Supplies are light on the small sizes and heavier on the larger sizes



Avocado - Market is very unstable. Growers have slowed down their harvest, coupled with Mexico's labor day holiday. Mexican markets are going higher and not matching our market



Banana – Steady market on good volume and quality



Blackberries – Good supply and quality



Blueberries – Good supply and quality

CROP REPORT



Grapes – Softer markets on red grapes. Green grape supplies are getting tight



Lemons – Market is very active on smaller fruit. Subbing may be needed

MARKET



Limes – Supplies are very tight due to lower volume from Mexico due to weather



Mangoes - Good supply and good availability



Melons Cantaloupe – Decrease in offshore arrivals has cause the market to spike. Markets are expected to settle in the coming weeks. Quality has been great

CROP REPORT



Melon Honeydew – Production is strong with sizing mostly being 5ct and larger



Oranges – Market is steady and quality is very good



Pears – Market is steady and quality is good



Pineapple – Market remains strong with demand expected to drop off. Quality is good to very good

Raspberries – Good quality and supply



Strawberries – Good supply and great quality on all strawberries.



Watermelon – Quality is great out of South Florida with heavy volume. Market on large sizes has softened but 45ct and 60ct remain steady. Better volume available next week

Asparagus – Growing region has changed to Peru, Mexico is done. Quality and volume are good, market is steady



Broccoli – Supply is light this week



Cauliflower – Supply is very light this week



Carrots – Quality and supply are improving



Corn – The market is active but there is still good supply and quality available

Cucumber – Prices continue to drop. Production is strong in FL and Mexico. Quality is mostly good



Eggplant – Steady prices this week. Volume continues to be good. Some scarring issues reported



Garlic – Supply is firming up and markets are active



Ginger - Chinese markets are mixed, but quality is good. Product is available at higher costs from Brazil, Peru, and Thailand



Green Cabbage – Supply has improved and is good

Green Onion – Quality, supply, and demand are good



Kale – Supplies and quality are fair



Lettuce Iceberg - Good supply this week. Demand is expected to increase. Quality is very good and the market could go up



Leaf Green and Red- Supply is slightly above normal. Salinas crop is clean. Demand is good and weights are in the 18-20 range

Leaf Romaine – Supply is slightly above normal. Quality is good and product is clean

Leaf Romaine Hearts – Supply is normal this week and will continue

ALLINE

Onions – White market is high due to limited supplies, quality is fair to poor. Red market is high. Yellow market is steady with good quality



Pepper, Bell – Green quality is good but supply is tightening up. Red and yellow supply is up and down



Potato – Steady market with good quality



Spinach – Quality and supply are good



Squash – Yellow supply is short, increase should come soon.

Tomato - Round: Prices continue to drop. Florida production is strong and weather is good
