# 2015: A YEAR OF REGENERATION Spirit of Brotherly Love is Alive and Well

The Second Sunday of September was designated by the Polish National Catholic Church as the Solemnity of Brotherly Love.

At Mass on September 13, every member of the congregation received a brochure containing some history and several thoughts for reflection regarding the designation. A portion of the brochure contents is reproduced here.

#### SOLEMNITY

A Solemnity is a day of great importance in the Church commemorating significant events pertaining to our Lord Jesus Christ, the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph, All Saints, the Trinity, and the Holy Spirit. Solemnities that are unique to the Polish National Catholic Church include the Solemnity of Brotherly Love, the Solemnity of the Christian Family, the Solemnity of Humble Shepherds and the Solemnity of the Institution of the Polish' National Catholic Church.

#### SOLEMNITY OF BROTHERLY LOVE

In 1897 Father Hodur and a group of people organized the first Polish National Catholic Church, Saint Stanislaus Parish, in Scranton, Pennsylvania.

As the years went by Father Hodur was dismayed by the way others were mistreating members of our Church. He.was sometimes saddened by the manner in which some Church members responded to this injustice.

He was disappointed because the members of the Church were not following the Great Commandments. Father Hodur wanted the faithful to follow Christ and His teachings

In 1904 the First General Synod of the Polish National Catholic Church was held in Scranton, PA and in 1906 the First General Synod was reconvened to complete it. At these gatherings he proposed that we establish the Solemnity of Brotherly Love to be commemorated annually on the second Sunday in September as a reminder to all Polish National Catholics to be kind and loving to each other and to all people. Everyone at the Synod agreed and the Solemnity of Brotherly Love has been celebrated in the Polish National Catholic Church ever since. It is a day to remind us to love one another and to love all people.


#### THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT

The Greatest Commandments are taken from the story where Jesus is teaching and is asked by a Pharisee, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" Jesus' answer was, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." (Matt.22:34-40)

## St. Casimir's ANS Summer Social

On Sunday afternoon August 16, twelve members of St. Casimir's ANS Society gathered at the home of Janice Klimczak for some food, fun and fellowship. Despite the scorching temperature outside, everyone was cool as cucumbers in air-conditioned splendor as they greeted one another and munched appetizers and drank cold beverages. Each member made something delicious for the buffet - salad, delicate sandwiches, hot dishes and dessert.

After lunch a business meeting was held. The focus of the meeting was on how St. Casimir's ANS could help celebrate the Solemnity of Brotherly Love on September 13. The members decided that they would make paper quilts using greeting cards and Bible verses. These guilts will be placed at various locations around the church emphasizing the concept of Brotherly Love. Phyllis Hunt will be the group leader for the project. Also, all who attend Mass on the Feast of Brotherly Love will receive a token of remembrance made by ANS sisters: a HUGS/KISSES candy bag tied with ribbon and tagged with a verse from Scripture. Youth of the parish will be asked to distribute the candy bags as people leave the church. Following the Mass of Brotherly Love, everyone will be invited to a brunch at the Parish Center served by ANS members.

The last item discussed was the adoption of a special project to mark Regeneration 2015. The members agreed to collect items for the Girls of Bachand Hall in Lowell, MA. This program is run by Sister Cecile, a local nun. It gives young women a place to live safely as they finish their education and seek jobs. Some of the young women at Bachand Hall are homeless or out of foster care because they have reached a certain age. Parishioners of St. Casimir's will be asked to contribute to this cause. Kick off for this project is September 6 and will continue until mid-October.

When the meeting ended, members made a Prayer Blanket for an ANS sister who is in nursing home care. The Prayer Blanket was blessed at Mass by Fr. Tenus on August 23 and the congregation had the opportunity to touch the blanket and add their prayers.

With plans made and the meeting adjourned, attendees continued to have fun and enjoy each other's company. There was a game of BINGO, picture-taking, joke prizes and lots of laughter. Before departing the Summer Social, St. Casimir's ANS members sang "God Be With You Til We Meet Again".

#### ANS to Collect Items for Girls of Bachand Hall

On August 16, the ladies of St. Casimir's ANS society, meeting at the home of Janice Klimczak for their annual summer social agreed to a plan to collect items for the young ladies and residents at Bachand Hall in Lowell.

With the merger of the three hospitals in Lowell over the past two decades, the former residence of the Sisters of Charity of

Ottawa (SCO) who formerly staffed St. Joseph Hospital needed a mission. Since 2005, in collaboration with the Department of Children and Families the Sisters at **Bachand Hall welcomed** young women who have aged out of foster care but still need a supportive environment before launching out on their own. The young women, students at the nearby

University of Massachusetts-Lowell or at Middlesex Community College or in a career-training program; these women journey toward their independence.

The project is scheduled to run until October 18. Some items requested include shampoo, toothpaste and brushes, body wash soap and lotion, deodorant, small pack facial tissue, hair spray.


## **Growth Committee: A Progress Report**
