Epistle: Acts 20:16-18, 28-36

¹⁶ Paul had decided to sail past Ephesus to avoid spending time in Asia, as he was in a hurry to get to Jerusalem for the day of Pentecost, if that was possible.

Paul Meets with the Ephesian Elders

¹⁷ From Miletus he sent messengers to Ephesus to ask the elders of the church to meet with him. ¹⁸ When they came to him, he told them, "You know how I lived among you the entire time from the first day I set foot in Asia.

²⁸ Pay attention to yourselves and to the entire flock over which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers to be shepherds of God's church, which he acquired with his own blood. ²⁹ I know that when I'm gone, savage wolves will come among you and not spare the flock. ³⁰ Indeed, some of your own men will arise and distort the truth in order to lure the disciples into following them. ³¹ So be alert! Remember that for three years, night and day, I never stopped tearfully warning each of you. ³² "I'm now entrusting you to God and to the message of his grace, which is able to

build you up and secure for you an inheritance among all who are sanctified.

³³I never desired anyone's silver, gold, or clothes. ³⁴You yourselves know that I worked with my own hands to support myself and those who were with me. ³⁵In every way I showed you that by working hard like this we should help the weak and remember the words that the Lord Jesus himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'" ³⁶When Paul^l had said this, he knelt down and prayed with all of them.



Gospel: John 17:1-13 **The Unbelief of Jesus' Brothers**

7 After this, Jesus traveled throughout Galilee, because he didn't want to travel in Judea, since the Jewish leaders there were trying to kill him. ²Now the Jewish Festival of Tents was approaching. ³So his brothers told him, "You should leave this place and go to Judea, so that your disciples can see the actions that you're doing, ⁴since no one acts in secret if he wants to be known publicly. If you're going to do these things, you should reveal yourself to the world ⁵Not even his brothers believed in him.

⁶Jesus told them, "My time has not yet come, but your time is always here. ⁷The world cannot hate you, but it hates me because I testify against it that its actions are evil. ⁸Go up to the festival yourselves. I am not going to this festival yet, because my time hasn't fully come." ⁹After saying this, he remained in Galilee.

¹⁰But after his brothers had gone up to the festival, he went up himself, not openly but, as it were, in secret. ¹¹The Jewish leaders kept looking for him at the festival, asking, "Where is that man?" ¹²And there was a great deal of discussion about him among the crowds. Some were saying, "He is a good man," while others were saying, "No, he is deceiving the crowds!" ¹³Nevertheless, no one would speak openly about him because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders.

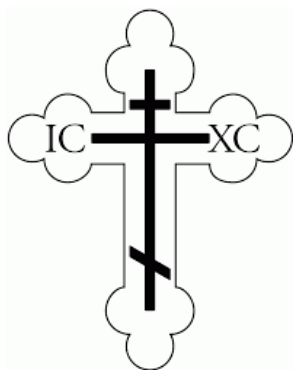

**Seventh Sunday of Pascha
The Fathers of the First Ecumenical Council**

Recognizing the divine Fathers of the First Ecumenical Council as heralds of the Faith after the divine Apostles, the Church of Christ has appointed this present Sunday for their annual commemoration, in thanksgiving and unto the glory of God, unto their praise and honor, and unto the strengthening of the True Faith.

The seventh Sunday after the Feast of Holy Pascha is observed by the Orthodox Church as the Sunday of the Fathers of the First Ecumenical Council. Moved with divine zeal and concern for unity, the Emperor Constantine the Great, equal to the Apostles, summoned the First Ecumenical Council in Nicaea, a city of Bithynia. It was in this place that the bishops of the Church gathered in 325. All of them, with one mouth and one voice, declared that the Son and Word of God is one in essence with the Father, true God of true God. The Fathers composed the holy symbol of Faith, the Nicene Creed,
