


Gulf Coast Orchid Society Newsletter

Our next meeting will be **Sunday, April 14, 2013**, at 2:00 at **Jeff Davis Community College** located at the corner of Switzer Rd and Debuys; just north of Pass Rd. in the large **cafeteria meeting room**. Orchids 101 will meet at 1:30 in the smaller meeting room. This month's topic will be "Terrestrial Orchids."

HOW TO FIND THE CAFETERIA: The cafeteria is located on the back or north side of the campus, continue on Debuys until it dead ends then turn left. If you look at the map below the driveway to the cafeteria is just below the 'J' in Jeff Davis.



PROGRAM: This month our member, Harvey Brenneise will talk on Darwin's Sexy Orchids: First Case Study on the Origin of species by Means of National Selection. Harvey is Associate Dean for Research Services at the University of Southern Mississippi. He has grown orchids since his childhood in California. His first orchid was a Cattleya trianae, which he wishes he still had! He has grown orchids in greenhouses, under lights, on the windowsill, and outside as appropriate in Michigan, Seattle, Southern California, Nebraska and Hattiesburg. For the Darwin celebration a couple of year ago, he developed a program for the AOS Members meeting at the Huntington Library on Darwin and orchids. We will get to see this program so it should be very interesting, exciting and informative.
