Philippians 2:14-15

# **Church News:**

● Annual Church Meeting: The annual meeting of the church will be Sunday, January 24, 2021. We will review 2020 church records, approve the 2021 budget and elect the council moderator for 2021 meetings. All church members and friends of the church are encouraged to attend. The meeting will start shortly after that Sunday's worship service; there will be a light lunch prior.

• Worship Services: We continue to be in the sanctuary for our Sunday worship service! It has been going well (we've been worshipping in the sanctuary since the beginning of September). Such a comfort to be back in our familiar surroundings.

It does look different as we've got the pews set up for social distancing. But we are using the church hymnals and bibles and singing along with the music. Yes, we're still wearing masks and keeping social distancing. But, we're here! Please consider joining us. All are welcome.

For those who cannot attend, or who are still not yet comfortable attending public services, we continue to tape and post Sunday's service that Sunday afternoon on our Facebook page. In addition, Pastor Sue continues to lead a weekly prayer session. These will be livestreamed on our Facebook page on Thursdays at 8:30 am. The prayer service can be viewed live or accessed later by going to our Facebook page's Video section.

• Choir: As of the first Sunday in Advent, the choir is back to aid in Sunday worship. They sang a regular anthem each Advent Sunday and also had an anthem to present to the congregation during the Christmas Eve service.

As this was a successful return (in the opinion of the choir, the choir director, the pastor and the congregation), the choir will continue to sing every Sunday. So, Wednesday night choir rehearsals are back on. The choir, appropriately masked and seated at a proper social distance, now meets at 7:30 PM in Fellowship Hall. Come join them!

• Food Cupboard: As a continuing reminder, the food cupboards most needed items right now are toilet paper, hand soap, laundry detergent, dish soap and hearty soups. Because of shopping & purchasing restrictions (rationing), these are the hardest items to keep stocked. So please, buy an extra item on your next shopping trip and leave it in the box in the church entryway. Your donations are always well appreciated.

## Reoccurring Calendar Events (Monthly):

- Woman's Breakfast: meets the first Sunday of every month at Brady J's restaurant (Bloomfield) at 8:00 AM. All interested women are invited; being a member of the church is not a requirement. For this period, the group meets January 3rd and February 7th.
- Special Offering: An extra offering plate is passed on the first Sunday of every month. This is a special offering to support church outreach to the local community and local missions and is kept in the Benevolence Fund for future distributions. For this period, the offerings are on Sunday, January 3rd and February 7th. The offering basket will be

available at our live service. However, if you are unable to attend, please contact Janice Kelly, our Benevolence Secretary, to make arrangements for your gift.

- Thursday, January 21 (10:30 AM): Book club meets in Fellowship Hall; they will discuss the novel *The Handmaid's Tale* by Margaret Atwood.

**Amazon synopsis**: The Handmaid's Tale is a novel of such power that the reader will be unable to forget its images and its forecast. Set in the near future, it describes life in what was once the United States and is now called the Republic of Gilead, a monotheocracy that has reacted to social unrest and a sharply declining birthrate by reverting to, and going beyond, the repressive intolerance of the original Puritans. The regime takes the Book of Genesis absolutely at its word, with bizarre consequences for the women and men in its population.

The story is told through the eyes of Offred, one of the unfortunate Handmaids under the new social order. In condensed but eloquent prose, by turns cool-eyed, tender, despairing,

passionate, and wry, she reveals to us the dark corners behind the establishment's calm facade, as certain tendencies now in existence are carried to their logical conclusions. *The Handmaid*'s *Tale* is funny, unexpected, horrifying, and altogether convincing. It is at once scathing satire, dire warning, and a tour de force. It is Margaret Atwood at her best.

**Amazon synopsis:** In this tantalizing thriller from a #1 New York Times bestselling author, a woman uncovers lifelong secrets as she searches for the truth behind her father's involvement in a heist gone wrong.

Now he's back in town to care for his ailing father—and to keep his eye on the county's corrupt district attorney, whom he suspects was the real murderer. Although the two are bound to silence because of the crime they committed together, each has spent years waiting and hoping that the other will make a fatal misstep. But the arrival of their elusive accomplice's daughter, Arden, who may know more about the missing money than she's

telling, sets them both on red alert. She ignites Ledge's determination to expose the D.A.'s treachery . . . and sparks a desire he wishes to deny.
