Mother's Equal Pay Day is May 23rd

The typical woman working full time, year-round in the United States is paid just 80 percent of what men are paid, or a gap of 20 percent. Women around the country observed Equal pay Day in April, but mothers (and most women of color) have to wait even longer for their paychecks to catch up. Mothers' equal pay day, which takes place in May, represents the symbolic day when the median pay of mothers who work full time, year-round, catches up to the pay that working fathers received the previous year.

Recent Ruling in Favor of Aileen Rizo's AAUW Supported Equity Pay Case

On April 9, 2018 (the day before Equal Pay Day) the Ninth Circuit held that using prior salary alone cannot justify a wage differential. They ruled that this would perpetuate a gender wage gap in direct contrast of the intent of the Equal Pay Act of 1993. Read more about the case on the AAUW



This group is open to all AAUW members and we meet seasonally from October through May. You can choose day or evening group, just let the hostess know you will be there.




