Dear Beth Judah Congregants, Members, Friends and Guests,

Rabbi Isaacs, the Beth Judah Temple Board, and the Health & Safety Committee are happy to announce the reopening of Beth Judah Temple for in-person services May 6 and 7. Friday night services will begin at 7 p.m., and Saturday morning services will start at 9:30 a.m. In-person services are planned two weekends a month, supplemented with Zoom services on the other weekends.

The Health & Safety Committee, along with the Ritual Chair, have adopted the following protocols for those who attend services in person:

For those of you who are not vaccinated or not fully vaccinated, you may attend services, but from the time you enter the building until the time you leave, you must be fully masked with an N-95 mask.

For those who are vaccinated, we strongly suggest that you have at least two doses. We strongly suggest that you practice social distancing and wear an appropriate mask for the duration of the service.

With lengthy discussion regarding Oneg Shabbat and Kiddush, the Health & Safety Committee is recommending that we not dine on site at the moment. They will monitor the status of the virus and revisit this topic.

For those who cannot attend services in person, for whatever reason, Beth Judah has installed a brand new camera system to allow you to attend in real time via live stream on the temple Facebook site. (Zoom will continue to be used for weekends *without* in-person services; in-person service weekends will utilize live stream on Facebook.) You do not need to have a Facebook account.
