

I recently read Anne Lamott's new book, Hallelujah Anyway:

Rediscovering Mercy. She reminds us of the Micah 6:8 passage: "He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God."

The Micah passage supports

the message of Joel. Lamott's message fits as well. For me, she wrote in such a way that it caught my attention as she redefined the word mercy: "Mercy means we soften ever so slightly, so we don't have to condemn others."

May you feel the presence of God each day.




