# FROM THE PASTOR

June 23, 2019

**Solemnity of the Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ/Corpus Christi**  
Lk 9:11b-17

Dear St Pius X and St Anthony Church,

Last Sunday was Trinity Sunday and today is Corpus Christi! Why all these feast days, after Ascension and Pentecost! Because, if Pentecost is the great commissioning of the Church of Jesus to go “make disciples of all nations, baptizing & teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you”(Matt 28:19-20), then we need to have a *text to teach, or our class lessons to deliver*. So, these two feasts provide the teaching content of the two central mysteries of our Faith. These two core teachings of our faith are: 1) –God’s identity Who God is, and 2) Our identity- Who we are. God is a Divine Trinity: Father, Son & Holy Spirit, and we through Baptism are drawn into that life, becoming members of Christ’s Body. Baptism makes us sharers in Christ’s Body and Blood. And today our focus is upon the Mystery of the Body of Christ.

What is the Body of Christ? It is the Holy Eucharist, the Real Presence of Christ in the Church. Preeminently it refers to the actual elements of bread and wine become Christ’s Body & Blood. Jesus clearly said “This is my Body....” (Luke 22:19–20; Matthew 26:26–28; Mark 14:22–24; 1 Corinthians 11:23–25). And I believe Jesus! So, above all, Jesus is present to us through these sacramental elements of the Holy Eucharist. Yet, also in every celebration of Mass-Eucharist, we find Jesus present to us in three additional ways: 1) in his Word, 2) in the gathered assembly, and 3) in His ministers. Christ is present to us through His Word, as John 14:23 says, “Whoever loves me will *keep my word*, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and *make our dwelling with him*”. Christ is present in His gathered assembly of followers as He said in Matthew 18:20 “Where two or three are gathered in my name, *there am I in their midst*.” And Christ is present in His Minister-Apostles as Jesus said in John 13:20 “Whoever receives the one I send, *receives me*...”. Last Sunday we reflected upon the unity (one divinity) found among three persons in God, and so today we reflect upon the divine unity found among a plurality of human persons in Christ’s body. St Paul outlines this in 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, “The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a *participation in the blood of Christ*? The bread that we break, is it not a *participation in the body of Christ*? Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf.” Jesus had said we have union with God in Him, “Remain in me, as I remain in you” (John 15: 4). Jesus had prayed with the Father for our unity with each other at the Last Supper saying, “I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one” (John 17:23).

Today’s feast of ‘Corpus Christi’ teaches us that our communion in Christ is not a solitary one (only me and Jesus), but a communal one (shared with all believers). If I am in Christ and you are in Christ, then we are one in Christ. This is why I see the two steps just before we approach the altar for Holy Communion to be so critical. The ritual actions and words reveal our simultaneous communion with each other in Christ. For example, in mass, just after the consecration prayer of the priest and our assent to the prayer in the great Amen, we offer two signs of communion with our other brothers and sisters in Christ. 1) We pray together the Lord’s Prayer and 2) exchange with one another a sign of His peace. Before I approach the table of the Lord to receive His Body and Blood, I acknowledge His presence in my brothers and sisters by praying for forgiveness from both Christ and all others, (“forgive us our trespasses for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us,” Luke 11:4). Then I show this forgiveness/peace by extending a ‘hand of fellowship’ (Gal 2:9) to everyone. In the Early Church, they called this the holy kiss of peace (Romans 16:16 & 1 Cor 16:20). After these public signs of communion with each other, only then do we approach the altar to receive Christ’s Body and Blood. Jesus commanded this work of peace in Matthew 5:23-24 when he said, “*Therefore, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift there at the altar, go first and be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift.*”

There is a Jewish concept called ‘minyan’, which means a minimum number of worshippers (a quorum of ten) is required in order to conduct public prayer devotions. So, unless at least ten congregation members can gather at the synagogue, the public prayers cannot be offered. ‘Minyan’ emphasizes the presence of other people broadening one’s prayer interest and offering responsive songs/readings. Prayer is always a group effort, encouraging one another and fostering a greater sense of one’s community of faith. So for us too, Corpus Christi expresses God’s covenant of unity with all of us (plural). Our communion with God is also communion with one another. I see this unity in all traditional Corpus Christi Procession Devotions, because they are public manifestations of united efforts of prayer and witness as the church, processing together following the Blessed Sacrament as one people following one Lord together in song and prayer. As I heard a procession participant saying once, “Here is the Body of our Lord for all to see!” Yet, the best news of all is that Christ’s real presence in the Body of His Church, is not just revealed on Feasts like Corpus Christi, but every day, all the time at any daily mass!
