A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DON.....

Dear Siblings, Sisters, and Brothers in Christ!

Grace and Peace to you from God the Father; From our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ; In, with, and through the Holy Spirit. AMEN!

At the time of this writing, the opening day of the Wisconsin Deer Gun season is tomorrow, Thanksgiving Day is the next Thursday we encounter, and the season of the Advent of the coming of our Lord and Savior begins on November 27th. I have been here as your Interim Bridge Pastor since November 1, and I have enjoyed my time here with you all, and deeply appreciate the manner in which you have welcomed me. I am looking forward to experiencing with you the joy, the anticipation, and the uncertainty that New Beginnings can bring.

This New Beginning that you are all anticipating comes on the heels of a number of critical stages in your history: consequences and conflict which erupted because of a debilitating global pandemic; the departure of a beloved and relatively long-term Pastor; the unanticipated departure of a dedicated Interim Pastor; and the arrival of the guy with a beard and a ponytail (ME!) who is to 'Interim-Bridge' Burke Lutheran church into its future toward a new, called, settled Pastor.

My contract with you here calls for me to do a number of things, preach, teach, reach, visit, marry, officiate funerals, and lead you in worship. My call as an ELCA Lutheran Pastor also mandates that I speak the truth to you in ways that you can hear it. That is the purpose of this writing that I bring forth to you today within these four corners: truth, and reality.

Last year's total budget for Burke Lutheran Church was \$155,600. This congregation contributed \$2,750 in mission support to the Synod, for global giving. Total debt of this congregation at the end of the last fiscal year was \$483,546. Total savings, reserves, and endowments at the end of the last fiscal year was \$521,000. This congregation is anticipating an influx of approximately \$1,000,000 from the sale of a portion of your land. So as you can see, assets, and potential assets abound, which can help facilitate this congregation into the New Beginnings, and new and innovative ministries undertaken by this congregation to love God, and to love and serve the neighbor who is in need.

The Ministry Site Profile, which is the document submitted by this congregation to identify and call a full-time, settled Pastor, with up to nine years of experience, who has, amongst a number of other identified and expected talents, technological ability, and strengths in ministry to seniors AND youth and family

ministry, is not overly ambitious. What is unrealistic, however, is to expect to compensate a full-time Pastor at \$60,000 to \$65,000 total defined compensation, as set forth in this congregation's Ministry Site Profile. Here's why.

This Synod, of which Burke is a part, has established minimum compensation guidelines. The guidelines for base salary, for a Pastor of between no and nine years experience is \$40,750 to \$47,834. Housing allowance, in the case of not having a reasonable parsonage for a Pastor and family to move into, for Dane County is \$40,600 per year. On top of that number (\$81,350 to \$88,434) is payment to the Pastor for Social Security Allowance, PLUS 12% of that total number for retirement compensation (roughly \$10,000). And then, on top of that is the Health Insurance premium paid for the Pastor and Pastor's family (if there are family members) which can total in the neighborhood of \$20,000, depending on the plan. The total defined compensation (you can do the math) is well beyond what your budgeted amount is, understanding all the while that having a Pastor in your congregation is a ministry itself.

I know that I have just given you a lot of information, probably more information, because of its truth and reality, than you wanted to confront at this juncture. But this information needs to be considered by the congregation as a whole, when deciding what to look for and expect when calling a Pastor.

The total defined compensation for a Pastor that you identified is not beyond your reach, even though it seems daunting. This congregation needs to decide what manner of Pastoral support you can reasonably contemplate. Perhaps if the compensation figures are not what you can reasonably support, this congregation could look at calling a part-time Pastor (and if a Pastor is called 50% of the time, that means that half of the Sundays of any given month that Pastor would not lead worship, and this congregation would need to find Pastoral supply for worship, or rely upon lay leadership) or consider sharing the ministry of a full-time Pastor with another nearby congregation.

Some words are hard to hear. But some words need to be heard, and addressed. I will do whatever I can to help you navigate this journey into your next called Pastor, and into your New Beginnings. And remember this, God will always have a Church.

May the Holy Spirit guide you all and keep you in grace.
