
## Upminster Methodist Church

It was good to have recognition in the Upminster Residents Bulletin in January, which mentioned our festival as a highlight of community events at Christmas. We welcomed several new tree decorators from the Upminster community–Steward Ave Allotments, St Joseph's Catholic Primary School, Oglethorpe Primary School and Springfield Playgroup and Upminster Childminders.

We would like to thank everyone involved in the Festival -The Monday Maintenance group who worked hard putting up the trees, climbing ladders to put up decorations in the church and the halls, and then taking the trees down and cleaning up the church after the event.

The people involved in making and serving refreshments for the Saturday market, the great team who approach the local businesses and shops for sponsorship and the group who acted as stewards during the week – your friendly smiles and warm welcome was noted by so many visitors.

Thanks to Amber Shotton's hard work, we had all the local Primary schools taking part in the event and on several afternoons some of the Primary school choirs came and sang in the church.

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"Stories under the Christmas tree," organised by Judith Reed, were enjoyed by children who came after school to hear Christmas stories and do crafts- at one session we counted 23 children busy doing crafts and listening to stories at the front of the church.

The festival ended on Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> with a very informal closing service of "Sing – along- a -Carols," and once again we entered in to the spirit of the occasion with Christmas jumpers and hats – the lights on the trees were turned off and the Christmas Tree festival 2017 came to a close – it was a lovely ending to a great week.

The votes for the favourite tree were counted by Ian and Julie Leadley and the winners were St Joseph's Catholic Primary school, "I went to the animal fair", which won the Festival Cup. The Festival Organisers choice was "Noel in the Countryside" decorated by the French Group and this was awarded the "Best in the Festival" certificate.

A special thank you and recognition to those decorators who have been involved for the past seven years but have never won. Thank you for taking part so willingly each year.

Just over £1300 was raised this year, so £650 will be sent to each of the charities we have supported this year- First Step Opportunity Play Group and Methodist Homes.


