Patriot Biography: John Cate

John Cate was born in Barrington, NH in the Cate Garrison House built by his father Captain William Cate, Patriot (1698-1783) as a defense from attacks on the town by the French and Native Americans. His mother was Elizabeth Cotton (1705-1800) of Portsmouth, NH. The Cate family was active in town affairs. John's father William was one of the founders of the town of Barrington, established on land granted by the crown to citizens of Portsmouth who repaired HMS Barrington, a frigate damaged by a storm in the Caribbean. John married Mary Garland, daughter of John Garland, Patriot (1719-1805) and Molly Rand (1726-1769) on 11 Oct 1762 in Barrington. John served as Selectman for the town in 1771 and 1772 and again from 1774 to 1804. He signed the Association Test in 1776. John followed in his father's footsteps in the New Hampshire Militia. In 1775 he served as First Lieutenant in Captain Samuel Hayes' company on Pierce's Island at Fort Washington, one of the harbor defenses for Portsmouth Harbor erected after the British burning of Falmouth, MA in October. In 1776 he served again in Colonel Joshua Wingate's regiment in the defense of Fort Ticonderoga. From September to December, 1777 he served in Colonel Drake's regiment to reinforce General Gates at Saratoga. General Burgoyne disparaged militia forces for not having artillery. Colonel Drake combed the harbor defenses for spare cannon and equipped his men with artillery. The unit was involved in the battle including General Burgoyne's final defeat and surrender. From July to October, 1780 John served again in Colonel Bartlett's regiment for the defense of West Point during the time of Benedict Arnold's betrayal. John and Mary raised a family of seven sons and six daughters. Mary died in 1786 and John died in 1815. Both are buried on the old family farm in Barrington.





It is with sadness that I have to inform you that our fellow compatriot James Howard Skaggs passed away on Novermber 15th 2019. He was a member of the Palo Verde Chapter of Arizona SAR and Immediate Past President of the Arizona Society Sons of the American Revolution. He was very active with the DAR and C.A.R. organizations. He will be missed.
