

"Filling the Earth"

"God blessed them; and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it..."

Genesis 1:28

During my college years the cultural elites were influenced by Stanford biologist Paul Ehrlich who wrote *The Population Bomb*, in which he famously pronounced, "The battle to feed all of humanity is over." He went on to predict that hundreds of millions of people would be starving to death by the end of the 1970s, including 65 million Americans. England, he predicted, would not exist by the year 2000.

He was wrong. Other American scientists like Norman Borlaug produced the Green Revolution which developed high-yielding plants and effective agricultural techniques that dramatically improved food production around the world. Meanwhile the world poverty rate decreased from 36% in 1990 to 10% in 2015, according to the World Bank.

In my college days there were groups on campus calling for drastic measures to reduce population growth to save the planet. The concern now among many of the supposed experts is that the world is facing a depopulation problem. The fertility rate is the average number of children produced per female. An average rate of 2.1 children per woman is needed for any population to sustain itself over time. The current world-wide rate is estimated to be 2.4. But it has been dropping rapidly in recent years and is projected to be 1.7 by 2100 by the "experts."

The fertility rate in China has dropped to 1.68. In Russia it is 1.76. In Europe it is 1.55. In the US it is 1.77. Our overall population in the US keeps increasing largely because of immigration. For some reason there are not a lot of people who want to immigrate to China and Russia.

The problem is that declining fertility rates produce societies where there are fewer people to sustain aging populations. In his book *What to Expect When No One's Expecting* author Jonathan Last warns that without enough babies, societies age and become top-heavy as the labor force and tax base shrinks. That makes it more difficult to finance programs like Social Security.

Widespread contraception, legalized abortion, education, careers, urbanization, and economic insecurity have all played a part in this fertility decline. Some also suspect that cultural attitudes that disparage mothers and motherhood play a part. These things should be of concern for us as Christians. The Bible calls children "blessings." We should be promoting motherhood and encouraging the healthy growth of families. Researchers have found that childbearing rates among conservative Protestants have become "statistically indistinguishable" from non-Christians. Colson Center for Christian Worldview president John Stonestreet says, "Even among Christian couples, the idea of not only delaying children but choosing to not have them at all is, in many circles, noncontroversial."

God seems to want the world to be full of "blessings." We should do what we can to encourage the growth of healthy families.


In sending the Gospel to the ends of the earth, we are also sharing God's Word with dozens of unreached people groups and going to hard-to reach places to make His Name known.
