BOYCOTT IN ENGLAND

The Simon Wiesenthal Center thanks its 25,000 online activists who helped lead the protest against the boycott of universities in Israel by the British Association of University Teachers, by signing the Center's online petition. The controversial boycott was abandoned at a special meeting held today in London.

The boycott, proposed in solidarity with the Palestinian people, would have barred faculty members of Haifa and Bar Ilan Universities from joint research projects and conferences with their British counterparts.

"We are relieved that the boycott was overturned and are buoyed by the burst of international indignation that exposed the AUT's initial move for what it was - a politically motivated attack," said Rabbi Abraham Cooper, associate dean of the Wiesenthal Center, adding that had the boycott been passed, it would have unfairly singled out the very sector of Israeli society that guarantees its democratic institutions and traditions. "Today's move marks the end of one skirmish in the ongoing war to delegitimize Israel," Cooper concluded.

Bubbe by Nettie Seder, feels very Keesy this month. So, let's start with 2 versions of a perennial favorite,

Key Lime Pie.

Then, after dessert, we can talk about some fish.

Fast & Easy

Pre made graham cracker or Chocolate crumb shell
One can of sweetened condensed milk (or fat free)
One 8 oz container of Cool Whip (regular, lite or fat free)
1/3 to 1/2 cup Key lime juice (jarred is ok)

Beat the Key lime juice into the condensed milk, use the amount to suit your taste. Blend in about 3/4 of the Cool Whip and pour mixture into the pie shell. Put into freezer about 1/2 hour. Top with remaining Cool Whip, store in freezer until 5 or 10 minutes before serving.

You can also make it with about 1/2 cup pureed Calamondem oranges (a small local sour orange).

Weight Watcher variation

Reduced Fat graham cracker pie crust
2 - 8 oz, artificially sweetened Key Lime Yogurt
4 oz boiling water
Lime Sugar free Jell-O
8 oz container of Cool Whip

Dissolve the Jell-O in the boiling water, (use 1 or 2 T of lime juice as part of the water) Beat in the yogurt, then about 3/4 of the Cool Whip. Put into the Fridge for about 1/2 hour until set, then cover with the remaining Cool Whip.

This pie can be made with any combination of Jell-O and yogurt that you might like. Try peach, strawberry (with a few fresh strawberries mixed in) or raspberry. Experiment and enjoy.

COMMEMORATING THE HOLOCAUST

About the Holocaust there are two main approaches we encounter:

- 1) acceptance, out of religious fear of God, which sees in the Shoa (Holocaust) God's will;
- 2) doubt and rejection, rebellion against religion, "God is dead", "life is absurd".

We, who were not there, cannot comprehend the Holocaust, but we can identify with our brothers who suffered horrors and try to comprehend their acceptance or rejection.

In his book "Faith after the Holocaust" E. Bercovich writes: We have to listen to the testimony of those who were there in the Shoa and to their reactions. There are those who continued with their faith with "emuna shlema", and there are those who lost their faith. I can understand them. They suffered the unimaginable. I believe that God himself understands them. I believe in God. I, who was not there, I cannot rebel against God because it would mean "profanation of the victims". How could I dare rebel if they accepted our faith.

On the other hand I cannot accept. It's because I was not there that I do not dare accept, how can I, if those who suffered the unimaginable lost their faith.

But I cannot doubt, not when I hear the martyrs words "ani ma'amin", I believe. I believe because they believed. But at the same time I don't know how to believe,....

We must believe and we must doubt, for the victims sake. This is a complex situation, but this is where we Jews stand after the Shoa.
