Condensed

The Ralston City Council met in a regular session on Tuesday, July 19, 2016 at 5:30 pm at Ralston City Hall. Roll was called with the following present: Konwinski, Fideline, Alberhasky, Krause, Sanchez, Preis and Mayor Groesser. The agenda for this meeting was available at City Hall for public inspection and posted prior to the meeting. The legal notice for the meeting was published in the Ralston Recorder. Claims listed are approved and part of these minutes.

Pastor Lynette Janssen, Ralston United Church of Christ gave the Invocation.

Mayor Groesser said the meeting is subject to the Nebraska Open Meeting Act and that a copy of the Act is posted at the rear of Chamber.

Groesser welcomed guests and press.

Motion to approve Consent Agenda made by Konwinski, second by Fideline. All vote yes, motion carried.

Klinker said the recent lawsuit was settled in the City's favor. Yochum said that DBOA meets again August 9, 2016 at the Arena. Murtaugh said that Coca-Cola delivered personalized bottles of soda to the RPD. Benis spoke to upcoming events at the Arena.

1. Swearing In of New Police Officers Cody Axon and Lucas Brown. Motion to swear in Officer Axon and Officer Brown by Krause, second by Alberhasky. All vote yes, motion carried. Murtaugh introduced the families of the new Officers. Murtaugh administered the Oath to the new Officers and introduced their Training Officers.
2. Police Award Presentation: Murtaugh presented Officer Herrick and Officer Winkelman with Letters of Commendation for their outstanding service.
3. Public Hearing for Order to Show Cause issued by the City of Ralston to Rally Motorsports, LLC. Klinker said he received a letter from Seran's attorney asking to postpone until September when the current tenant will have vacated the property. Krause moved to postpone the Hearing until the September 6, 2016 Council meeting, second by Alberhasky. Fideline votes no, rest of the Council votes yes, motion to table carried.
4. Dennis Leslie, 20 Victoria LN, Hot Springs Village, AR thanked Officer Herrick for his assistance.
5. Konwinski, Alberhasky and Sanchez thanked the RPD for their service.

Consideration of Executive Session for the Protection of the Public Interest for the Purpose of Discussion of Strategy Regarding Pending Litigation was moved by Krause, second by Alberhasky. All vote yes, moved into Executive Session at 6:08 PM. Groesser stated "It has been moved, seconded and passed that the Council go into closed session for the purpose of discussion of strategy regarding pending litigation. The closed session is necessary for the protection of the public interest."

At 6:18 PM Groesser stated "We are reconvened in open session. I confirm that no subject matter other than the pending litigation was discussed. No formal vote, informal vote, straw vote or poll was taken during the closed session."

There being nothing further of a general nature to come before the Council, the Meeting was adjourned at 6:20 PM.
