Directions:
From Southern California you can come north on Hwy 14 to Hwy 178 west towards Lake Isabella (it'll be a left turn). About 19 miles there is a brown BLM sign (on your right) advertising Chimney Peak Recreation area. About $3 / 4$ of a mile past that on the south (left) side of the Hwy is a row of mail boxes with a little sign that says Frank St. Turn left, come up 3/4 of a mile and make a right onto Smith Ave. Follow our fence line and make a right into the drive.

If you are coming north on Hwy 395, come into Inyokern and take Hwy 178 west, then turn onto Hwy 14 South for three miles, then make a right turn on Hwy 178 west, then follow the above directions.

From Northern California, come down 395 and make a right onto 178 West. Then follow the directions above.

If you're coming from Bakersfield come up (Hwy 178). Come through Lake Isabella, Weldon, Onyx. About six miles east of Onyx on the south side of the road (right) there is a BLM fire station. About a mile past that, there is a row of mail boxes and a sign that says Frank St. Make a right. Come up 3/4 of a mile and make a right on to Smith Ave, follow our fence line and make a right into the drive.
