DESCRIPTION: Extremely rare one of a kind Remington prototype recurve. In the mid-late 1960's Remington noticed the success both Colt and Browning were having with their archery divisions. Remington commissioned a number of prototype recurve bows to be made for evaluation.

I acquired this particular Remington bow from a guy who worked for Remington back in the day, and remembers taking a trip with a Remington colleague to obtain the prototype from the bowyer (doesn't recall who made it). Remington decided against going into the archery business.

Colt dissolved their archery line in the late 1960s and Browning switched to compounds and kept their archery line until it was sold to PSE, which kept the Browning name for a few years and then dropped it.

Other than the rarity, there is nothing exceptional about this bow. It has no defects but the finish is substandard (maybe as a test bow it was finished to a retail standard). Not a great shooter, but if you are a collector looking for an extremely rare name bow, here it is.
