Dear Fellow Veterans and Friends:

The Youngstown Business and Professional Association (YBPA) and the Niagara River Chamber of Commerce have invited the Officers and Members of V.F.W. Post #313 to participate in the Labor Day parade on Monday, September 5, 2016.

The YBPA selected us to be the Color Guard for the parade. To do that effectively we should have 14 participants; 2 on the banner, 1 Color Sgt., 8 on flags, 2 with weapons, and 1 driving the sound vehicle. The more that participate the better the impression.

With that in mind, dress should be one of the following:

- (1) V.F.W. Uniform: garrison cap, white shirt, black tie, black shoes or boots.
- (2) Military Uniform: dress uniform or fatigues.
- (3) Stylish Military/Veterans Attire: historic uniforms (i.e.; jungle fatigues and/or veterans hats and vests.)

PLEASE BE AT THE POST (434 THIRD STREET, YOUNGSTOWN) BY 10:00 A.M, so that we can assemble and make final arrangements for our participation TO LET YOUNGSTOWN KNOW WE ARE HERE!

The parade will start at noon. We will march from the Soccer field at Fort Niagara State Park to Church Street. At the conclusion, there will be a reception at the Old Fyfe and Drum on Main Street.

This parade not only celebrates Labor Day in the Village, but it also gives our VFW Post good public relations, as well as providing the residents of Youngstown and the surrounding communities a chance to respect our local Veterans.

A Brief History of the Healing Field of Honor

The first Healing Field display was held in September 2002 in Sandy, Utah.

The original field was organized by Paul Swenson, president of Colonial Flag and



founder of the Colonial Flag Foundation, in an effort to illustrate the sheer enormity of human loss that resulted from the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001.

Nearly 400 Healing Field displays have been organized since the first event.

More than \$6 million have been raised for a wide variety of service, civic and other nonprofit organizations

throughout the country.

Healing Field and Field of Honor displays generate millions of dollars in publicity for hosting organizations and sponsors every year.

More than 100 civic, service and nonprofit organizations have benefited from Healing Field displays since 2003.


