# Join Northeast Formula Vee

Formula Vee is the most successful open wheel road racing class in the United States, offering cost effective and exciting competition.

Excellent field sizes combined with the great road race courses in the Northeast create the perfect environment for thrilling race action.





As a newcomer to Formula Vee racing, the Northeast Formula Vee group (NEFV) will help you get on track as easily as possible by answering your questions and showing you the best way to get started living your dream of wheel-to-wheel competition.

Formula Vee is a restricted class based on the engine, transaxle, and front suspension of the air-cooled VW Beetle. These are installed in a formula car chassis. Modifications to the engine and drivetrain are limited. Details for allowed changes are outlined in the General Competition Rules book printed each year by the SCCA and enforced at each race event by official tech inspectors.

The cars are simple. Setups are straightforward, motors are durable and components are manageable.

# **TRANSPORT**

The Formula Vee is a small racecar, requiring only a small tow vehicle and trailer. It's also easy to move around at the track and service by yourself.



#### **COST PER RACE**

Formula Vee is the lowest cost racing class in the SCCA. With tough competition and large fields, on-track incidents, though rare, do happen.

Repairs are easy and parts are relatively inexpensive.

## COMPETITION

Driving around a racetrack is fun but the real thrill comes from wheel-to-wheel racing. Northeast Formula Vee, as one of the largest classes, means you always have someone to race with. The competition keeps you coming back for more.



#### TRACKS

Formula Vee races at the most famous road courses in the country.

In the North East Division you can race at:

- Lime Rock Park, CT
  1.5 mile road course
- New Hampshire Motor Speedway

  1.6 mile road course
- Pocono International, PA 2.0 mile road course
- New Jersey Motor Sports Park 2.3 mile road course
- Watkins Glen International, NY 2.4 mile road course
- Thompson International Raceway, CT 2.0 mile road course (coming in 2014!)

#### **SCHEDULE**

For Northeast Formula Vee, the SCCA racing season starts in April and runs through September with competition in both the New England Region (NER.org) and the North Atlantic Road Racing Championship series. You can run both series.
