St. Luke's will once again be collecting toys for Christmas for the clients of Hands of Hope Food Pantry. Gift Certificates and gift items for teens are encouraged as we always have more than enough for the younger children. Toys can be brought in any time beginning now through Dec. 17. If you are unable to shop, cash donations will be accepted and Denise and Robbie will do the shopping for you.

The toy distribution will be held on Saturday, Dec. 19th from 1:30-3:30.

Volunteers will be needed to help with snacks, help in the toy rooms, and help escort families to the toy rooms. There will be a meeting for volunteers immediately following the 8am service on Sunday, December 13 in the Fryer Room.

Volunteers will also be needed on Friday, December 18 from 3 pm until about 6 to set up the toy rooms. If you would like to volunteer, please put your name on the sign- up sheet which can be found in the back of the Church following each of the services.

This year St. Luke's will only be serving snacks. Volunteers are needed to make Christmas Cookies or to donate granola bars, fruit, such as tangerines, bananas, grapes, or apples, and juice boxes. Any food donations are to be dropped off to the kitchen on Friday, December 18.

The Vestry has been busy preparing for Saint Luke's future. Architect, Vince Piasante has been hired to facilitate the major capital improvement project ahead. We're all very aware of the sad state of the gingerbread on the exterior of

the church, but that is just the tip of the iceberg when it comes to the status of Saint Luke's buildings and grounds.

Vince has been on site on two separate occasions for a total of nearly four hours to assess the campus in advance of being awarded the contract. Most recently, the Building & Grounds Team, Warden, Interim Treasurer and Rector joined Vince for a tour of the campus during which discussion was held about known issues and wishes for the future. At the Vestry meeting of 11/17/15 a team of eleven was nominated to meet with Vince in early December to formally begin this new relationship.

Smaller jobs continue to get checked off the "honey do" list. The new lighting in our parking lot is fantastic! It lights the lot sufficiently but does not create an issue for our neighbors. Also, the boiler pump that feeds heat to the portion of Fryer Hall running from the restrooms forward to the offices expired recently and has been

replaced. Next up will be a fresh coat of paint on our Oak Avenue curbs so that the handicap spots and no parking zone are visibly identifiable

Each of us provided input into the future of Saint Luke's when we completed our surveys in preparation for the creation of our Parish Profile. If your schedule allows, please join in the "official" celebration of our parish's future when Bishop Stokes installs Father Ed as our new rector in the service titled Celebration of New Ministry. It's a beautiful service filled with wonderful tradition. 


