



• Adult help What vou do:

Why should we observe Lent?

This 40-day season of repentance and reflection that began on Ash Wednesday has three important purposes.

Lent helps us STOP, LOOK and LISTEN.

We observe Lent because it tells us to STOP and rest awhile — and to stop sinning. Lent tells us to **LOOK** inward for an honest self-examination, to look upward to see the cross of Jesus with healing and love, and to look forward to the hope of the Resurrection. And we observe Lent because it tells us to LISTEN — to the voice of God, the words of Christ and the movement of the Holy Spirit.

STOP, LOOK and LISTEN! These commands that are so crucial for travel safety are also important for our journey through Lent.

This year during Lent, Aldersgate will focus on prayer using a finger labyrinth.

Each Sunday you will pick up a maze when you pick up your bulletin.

Everyone will be a participant in this prayer style of worship. You will use your finger to go through the maze during special prayers.



At the end of the service you will leave your labyrinth on the table in the Narthex. They will be sanitized and will ready for the next Sunday's service.

Why? or Why Not!
