SUNDAY, JUNE 5 The Christian holy day of Pentecost, which is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter, commemorates the gift of the Holy Spirit. Wear red!

#### PAGE 2 A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR JULIE.....

Whenever I have the opportunity to read Scripture with folks, I appreciate the practice of "Dwelling in the Word" (a spiritual practice similar to Lectio Divina or "divine reading"). We'll be using this practice during our Wednesday afternoon Bible study at 1:30. Please, come and dig into the Word with us. As we listen to God and each other, share our questions and wonderings, the Holy Spirit is working to deepen faith. Take this familiar passage:

> <sup>27</sup> "But I say to you who are willing to hear: Love your enemies. Do good to those who hate you. <sup>28</sup> Bless those who curse you. Pray for those who mistreat you. <sup>29</sup> If someone slaps you on the cheek, offer the other one as well. If someone takes your coat, don't withhold your shirt either. <sup>30</sup> Give to everyone who asks and don't demand your things back from those who take them. <sup>31</sup> Treat people in the same way that you want them to treat you.

> <sup>32</sup> "If you love those who love you, why should you be commended? Even sinners love those who love them. <sup>33</sup> If you do good to those who do good to you, why should you be commended? Even sinners do that. <sup>34</sup> If you lend to those from whom you expect repayment, why should you be commended? Even sinners lend to sinners expecting to be paid back in full. <sup>35</sup> Instead, love your enemies, do good, and lend expecting nothing in return. If you do, you will have a great reward. You will be acting the way children of the Most High act, for he is kind to ungrateful and wicked people. <sup>36</sup> Be compassionate just as your Father is compassionate. (Luke 6)

This Scripture points us to our compassionate Father... who loves, cherishes, saves, and promises to restore the entire world. Our loving Father gives instruction in this passage on just how we are to participate in God's restoration of the world each and every day: through loving relationships with our neighbors and "enemies." The passage is quite straightforward. The verbs give the clues: Love. Do good. Bless. Give. Lend without expecting any return. Be kind and compassionate. Treat everyone on this planet the way you want to be treated. While this is not easy, the scripture's instruction is certainly clear.

When I spend time with a Scripture passage, I need to hear it more than once. I need to let it soak in. I need to *dwell* on it. I need to pray it. If I don't take the time required, it's too easy to think, "oh, that was nice, now I better get on to my to-do list." Pretty soon the nice Scripture passage is out of sight, out of mind. Maybe you are better than I am! With this passage, if you are willing, let's do two things.

First, pray this passage until one phrase grabs your attention. Let God give you an insight or phrase. Then, live with that phrase for the next week or more. Repeat it while you are doing dishes or driving tractor. Write it in ink on your hand. Use it as a mantra when you can't sleep at night. Put reminders on your bathroom mirror, on the steering wheel, or in your wallet, wherever it will be helpful to you.

Second, do something. Take action...now. Let God tell you what needs to get done. But do something. Our faith needs to be active after all. "Thoughts and prayers" only go so far. Ask yourself, what might lead you to be compassionate as our God is compassionate? Here are a few ideas:

- Learn something about those who are different from you. For example, watch a movie like *Just Mercy* or *The Hate U* Give or any number of documentaries that really make you think and grow.
- For an entire day, silently bless every person you meet. Make a habit of saying, "God, bless \_\_\_\_\_.
  Shower \_\_\_\_\_ with loving kindness." Do that with every single person you see whether you know them personally or not.
- Give something of value. Give directly to those who are hurting. For example, give a gift to ELCA Disaster Relief which will support people impacted by the war. Gifts designated to "Eastern Europe Crisis" will be used in full (100%) for direct response to assist those displaced by the Russian war against Ukraine. You can give online (<u>https://community.elca.org/eastern-europe-crisis-response</u>) or through Burke Lutheran. There is so much reward in compassionate, cheerful giving.
- Finally, hold yourself accountable and **tell** someone about your action step.

What's your idea? Whatever it is...Love. Love. Love. Love. That's what it's all about. I'm so grateful to God for the love showered upon me and you. Each day, we receive it. Each day, we do our best to live it and give it away.
