<u> The President's Message – September 2017</u>

ARE YOU READY?

Pretty soon you will be hearing Hank Williams Jr. on a Monday night singing: "Are you ready for some football?" Ready or not football season is here. High schools in Wisconsin already have two or three games under their belt. College football goes into high gear on Labor Day weekend and then comes September 10 when the Packers face the Seahawks at Lambeau Field. And all the fantasy teams are drafted and ready. Is everybody ready?

Not only is football starting but so is ministry season. The summer is over. The kids are back to school or off to college. Sunday School kicks off most likely on September 10. Many bible studies at congregations begin with a new topic and members are encouraged to attend. For all of these things to happen you have to be equipped and ready. Just as the football teams have been practicing and getting ready so have teaching and pastoral staffs been gearing up for ministry season. It is time to continue to equip God's people for living in this daily world through God's word in the school or the church.

It reminds me of the familiar passage that we need to take seriously: "And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to **equip** the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ" (Eph. 4:11-12 ESV). Just as a football player needs to be equipped to take the field and practice and get in shape before the game – so God's people need to be equipped with God's word for daily living. The Apostle Paul did not expect the 'church workers' to do all the work for the people, he wanted them to train the people to do the work themselves.

In the "Supplement to the Diploma of Vocation" which is part of the call document that a pastor receives with his call papers, it states: "In the name of the Triune God and by His authority, in order that we might carry out His mission to the world, we hereby authorized and obligate you: To equip and enable the members of the congregation to serve one another and those outside the fellowship of the congregation." Equipping is part of the calling a pastor has to the congregation. In a sense, he and the staff are sharing the ministry load of reaching out to fellow members and to those outside the congregation.

The District staff believes that equipping and helping you as a congregation is important as well. Our mission statement reads: *Encourage, network and equip Lutheran congregations of the North Wisconsin District-LCMS to vigorously make known the love of Christ.* The District staff and I are committed to walk alongside you as church workers and leaders of our congregations as together we make known the love of Christ. We will do whatever we can to equip and assist you in ministry, whether it's helping you with ministry concerns or with the call process to fill that vacant ministry position.

Wednesday Night Family Ministry at Mt. Olive, Weston

Why are Wednesday nights special at Mt. Olive?

Wednesday night is study night at Mount Olive Lutheran Church in Weston, WI. We have set aside this night for the entire church to come together for fellowship and studying God's Word. We have a church meal provided for families from 5:00-6:00pm. Families have time to eat with each other and other families before our study time begins. We have around 225 people come to these meals each week. After dinner, we break out in classes from 6:15-7:30pm. We have classes for people 3 years old-adults.

What educational opportunities do you provide on Wednesday nights and how many attend?

Our FISH (Families in Study Hour) study allows parents to learn the Bible with their kids age 3-5th grade, along with crafts, games, and snacks. We have about 50 adults and kids that join in on the FISH fun each week. The confirmation program is for our 6th and 7th grade students. We have 150 students attend the program. Fusion is our high school youth group that includes students in grades 8th-12th. Each week about 80-100 students attend. We also offer adult Bible classes that also have about 50-80 people attend.

How do you organize the leadership of these events? Is it all staff led?

Our programs are both staff lead and volunteer lead. We could not do any of our programs with out the amazing volunteers who step up to lead.

What advice do you have for other churches looking to expand their family ministry?

Churches can make Wednesday education nights very simple and family friendly. Focus on quality programs, not quantity. Wednesday nights are a great way for families to grow in God's Word together in our fast paced world.





Counselor Corner

THE OTHERS...

It was at a Promise Keeper event years ago in Boulder, Colorado that I first heard of this game plan for leaders. I believe it was Greg Laurie who said that--Every leader needs three other men in his life. He needs a Paul, as an seasoned mentor... a Barnabas for encouragement... and a Timothy, as a teachable student—as a future leader.

These are wise words that pastors need to heed in their professional lives. What can result are shared blessings—

- One remains teachable.
- One never does ministry alone.
- Others are brought into the ministry to help ensure its future.

The apostle Paul had all three men—He had Gamaliel as his teacher (Acts 22:3)... he had Barnabas ("Son of Encouragement") (Acts 4:36 & 9:27)...and he mentored Timothy—his "true son in the faith" (1 Timothy 1:2a). Paul was a model leader in this way.

In a contemporary context we too often find the absence of the three. Too many pastors do ministry alone... removing themselves from learning... and are not intentional about mentoring successors. This is both a lonely place to be... and one that short-changes ministry.

Paul also modeled "team ministry." On each of his missionary journeys he had a partner—to share the road and the load.

There is an underlying theme here. Ministry is relational. For the pastor, the primary relationship is with the Holy Spirit—who equips for ministry, including spiritual gifts for the work. And, as already referenced, there are the vital human connections that fulfill ministry.

There is a "love" connection that Christ Himself emphasized. As He did the final preparing of His disciples for the work ahead He told them—

"A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved

you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know

you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:34-35)

Three times in three sentences Jesus repeated the command "love one another." Love is to define professional relationships... as well as the ones impacted by ministry. Yes, when it comes to these "others" L-O-V-E is defined as Lord Our Very Essence—as we share in Christ.
