Murphys Volunteer Library's fifth annual Children's Dress-up Earth Day Event (it began five years ago as a Pirate Day event) was held in front of our library and in our upstairs Community Room on April 22, 2017 from 1:00 pm until 3:00 pm. The funds from a First Five mini-grant were used to purchase food, prizes, poster board, planting materials and the services of a face painter. Children and adults participated in the event. Our event was a wonderful success. Approximately 30 children attended the event with their families including moms, dads, grandparents, older siblings and friends of the families.

In the allotted two hours children and their family members participated in games and activities, planted seeds with a volunteer, had their face painted, ate healthy snacks, interacted with others, and learned more about the library. Students were excited about the variety of games and received a small prize after playing each game.

The favorite game was "Save the Fish" and children using a fishing pole with a magnet as a hook removed trash and recyclables from a small wading pool.




The interaction and involvement between children and adults was wonderful to observe. Earth Day was a perfect day to hold this event and we will consider holding it again on this weekend (day).

BOOK REVIEW by Suzanne Murphy


The Perfect Horse by Elizabeth Letts Publish Date: 2017, Ballantine Books

Equine Theft in World War II Europe

World War II history buffs and horse enthusiasts will find this story a fascinating read. During the last chaotic days of the war, the landscape of Europe was a wasteland of ruin and starving refugees. The Russians, marching from the east, threatened to brutally destroy any surviving signs of the Old World, and it was clear that the famed Arabian Thoroughbreds and Lipizzaner of Europe faced certain death. The equestrians who had kept these horses safe during the Nazi nightmare with their wit and determination, as well as a bit of trickery, feared that they could not prevent what seemed inevitable. At the last possible moment, American, Austrian and Polish horse lovers banded together to spirit the animals across Allied lines, escaping the gnashing jaws of the Russian Army. The rescue is a real nail-biter.

The Perfect Horse opens a window onto the last days of the war and the miraculous recovery of horses that the Nazis had stolen to use for breeding a master war house for the German Reich. Spies, turncoats, and General George Patton himself, all play a part in putting together a U.S. mission to rescue the remnants of the magnificent

breeds. The author has done a credible job in handling the many strands of the story, and her extensive research on topics as wideranging as the Spanish Riding School of Vienna, Polish stud farms, and U.S. horse racing provide heft to her writing. The author invites even casual readers to visit a world of horses that enchanted royalty and commoners alike and very nearly disappeared in the turmoil of World War II.



Letts can be forgiven for her somewhat overblown language when she writes about the beautiful beasts. She is, after all, a life-long devotee of all things equine, inspired during childhood by Marguerite Henry's books, especially White Stallions of Lipizza. Her book stands as a testament to heroes who undertake, at great risk, missions to save lives and ideas, and treasures that represent human civilizations.




