And even though a lot of metal detectors today are “turn-and-go” type machines; they can still be adjusted to get optimum depth & sensitivity in various hunting situations. *So once again--review that instruction manual, available field tests, and instructional videos (via DVD or you tube online) for your particular metal detector.* And always remember, there is no substitute for experience in the field! (enough said –gitter dun!)


