Hello Everyone!

t's been an event-filled season in the life of our church, community, and world. We see the number of Covid cases dropping and restrictions lifting on an almost weekly basis. Just in the past month, we've seen our church reopen for indoor worship at a quarter capacity, to now being able to be at 100 percent capacity.

We've seen restaurants and movie theatres open, and even sporting events can have fans again. I can't think of anything that is still absolutely closed and barred from the public (although I'm sure some things still are restricted access). It feels as though this year-long phase of closures, restrictions, and guidelines are nearing some end. Normalcy might just be returning.

So, as we enter into this new phase of returning, reopening, and readjusting, I wanted to share a few thoughts about all of those things. Firstly, in terms of returning, return at your own pace. We can be excited about getting back into the old routine, getting back into the old places, and seeing those old faces in person. But for many of us, it's not best for our health to return. Others do not feel safe quite yet returning to public spaces, especially sitting in church for an hour or so. I want you to know, there is no pressure to return immediately, and we will not put that pressure on you. We will continue our services online on Zoom for quite a while, allowing you to participate from home until you are healthy or in a good place to return.

Of course, if you just like the idea of doing church in your pajamas moving forward, I encourage you to remember the importance of gathering together and sharing fellowship together!

As for getting back to normal, well, that's where things are not as clear. Choirs, communion, passing the offering plate, and donuts; we do not know when all those elements will return. But that's okay! We still get to gather and worship the Almighty God and have fellowship with one another.

The truth is, we might need to prepare our hearts for the reality that church might never go back to where it was before. Online, in some capacity, is here to stay.

Spring Break


