The Valley of the Kings:

Research and discoveries in several of the lesser known tombs.

The talk will cover Don's investigation of the tombs (which tourists never enter in The Valley of the Kings) that revealed the mummies identified as the female pharaoh, Hatshepsut; and Tutankhamun's wife, Ankhesenamun (amongst others). Don will tell us about his discoveries and adventures, from when he started working in the Valley, in 1989; and bring us right up to date with the surprising finds he made in tombs explored in 2017, namely the rediscovery of the three tombs (KV 50, 51, 52) which contained animal mummies when originally encountered by Theodore Davis in 1906. He has some interesting stories to share.
