AN ORDINANCE

To amend the traffic control map and file for the City of Fostoria, Ohio, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Fostoria, Ohio has undertaken a review of the traffic control map and file of the City, and deems it necessary to amend said map and file; and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Fostoria, Ohio deems said amendments necessary to preserve the flow of traffic in a safe and efficient manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

SECTION 1. The Traffic Control Map and Traffic Control File of the City of Fostoria, Ohio are hereby amended to read and show as follows:

- A. That a stop sign shall be placed at the intersection of Park and Wainwright.
- B. Repeal: D-205 7-5-83 Parking a motor vehicle on the south side of Sandusky Street from a point 20 feet from the east line of Town Street to a point 220 feet from the east line of Town Street prohibited except on Monday through Friday when it shall be lawful for the operator of a motor vehicle to stop said vehicle for the purpose of loading and unloading SCHOOL children, provided, said vehicle is attended by the operator of the same at all times while such vehicle is stopped.
- C. Repeal: D-304 9-18-84 (A) Unlawful to park a motor vehicle on the south side of Sandusky Street from the east curb line of Town Street to a point 100 feet east of the east curb line of Town Street. (B) SCHOOL bus stop established for taking on and discharging passengers along the south line of Sandusky Street from a point 100 feet east of the east curb line of Town Street to a point 140 feet east of the Town Street curb line. This space shall be reserved for the use of SCHOOL buses and it shall be unlawful for the owner or operator of any other vehicle to park such vehicle within any part of such space Monday through Friday of each and every week.
- D. Repeal: D-374 8-20-85 (A) Unlawful to park a motor vehicle on the east side of Perry Street from the north curb line of High Street to a point 40 feet

northwesterly on the east curb line of Perry Street. (B) Unlawful to park a vehicle other than a SCHOOL bus on the east side of Perry Street from a point 40 feet northwesterly from the north line of High Street along the easterly curb line of Perry Street to a point on the easterly curb line of Perry Street which is 125 feet northwesterly from the north curb line of High Street. SCHOOL buses shall be permitted to park in the 85-foot space for loading and unloading passengers.


- E. Repeal: 90-48 7-17-90 It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle on the south side of Rock Street from a point 120 feet west of the west line of Gerlock Drive to a point 160 feet west of the west line of Gerlock Drive from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. when Riley SCHOOL is in session.
- F. Update: 2010-91 12-21-10 Right turn prohibited when facing red traffic signal at intersections of Van Buren and Vine Sts. between 7:00 a.m. - 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. on SCHOOL days.
- G. Repeal: 99-27 3-16-99 No parking on the south side of Rock St. from the southwest curblineline of Gerlock Dr. and Rock St. to the southeast curblineline of Rock St. and N. Union St. from 7-9 a.m. and 2-4 p.m. on SCHOOL days.
- H. Repeal: 2011-42 8-16-11 Parking is hereby prohibited on Thomas Street beginning at the eastern line of North Union Street and extending east for a distance of 750 feet during SCHOOL days on from 2:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m.
- I. Repeal: 2010-70 9-21-10 (b) No vehicles shall be parked on Rock Street between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 8:30 a.m., and 2:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m.
- J. Repeal: 2010-85 12-7-10 No vehicle shall be permitted to turn right on red at the intersection of Town Street and Buckley Street between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. and 3:30 p.m. on SCHOOL days.
- K. Repeal: 2011-56 10-5-11 Thomas Street east of Union Street is hereby designated a one-way street (westbound) from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. for all motor vehicles except SCHOOL busses on SCHOOL days during the 2011-2012 SCHOOL year of the Fostoria City SCHOOLS.
- L. Repeal: 2002-70 6-18-02 Parkway Drive made 2-way; one-way sign moved from SW corner of St. Wendelin High SCHOOL parking lot to NW corner of Fostoria SCHOOL Administration Bldg. parking lot. "No Outlet" sign placed in original location of one-way sign. Remainder of Parkway Dr. that is one-way remains one-way.
- M. Repeal: 01-114 11-7-01 N-S alley E of Field SCHOOL becomes one-way S from W. Sixth St. to W. Jones St.

SECTION 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


SECTION 3. This ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare. The reason for this emergency is that the aforesaid amendments are critical to public safety, and orderly and efficient traffic flow.

THEREFORE, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, and signature by the Mayor, this ordinance shall go into immediate force and effect.



AN ORDINANCE

Adopting an Amendment to the Financial Recovery Plan for the City of Fostoria, Ohio, and declaring an emergency to exist.


SECTION 2: That this ordinance shall be published in accordance with the laws of the State of Ohio and City of Fostoria.





AN ORDINANCE

Establishing the Fiscal Year 2020 permanent appropriations, and declaring an emergency to exist.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

SECTION 1. To provide for the current expenses and other expenditures of the City of Fostoria, Ohio during the fiscal year ending December 31, 2020, the sums indicated on the attached sheets, and which are made part of this ordinance, be, and they are hereby, set aside and appropriated.


SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall be published in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Sections 731.21 and 731.22.





### AN ORDINANCE

Entitled and Ordinance Authorizing an Advance to the General Capital Fund with such Advance to be repaid before year end 2020, and declaring an emergency

WHEREAS, an advance of resources is needed in the General Capital Fund in order to provide funds until future income tax monies are received, and

WHEREAS, the General Fund has sufficient appropriated funds to advance necessary funds.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

SECTION 1: That One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) be advanced to the General Capital Fund 401-000-490200 from the General Fund 101-901-573040 with such advance to be repaid before end of calendar year 2020.

SECTION 2: That this ordinance shall be published in accordance with applicable Ohio Law.

SECTION 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


SECTION 4: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Fostoria and its inhabitants, and in order to meet pending obligations, this measure is determined to be an emergency ordinance and shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.

THEREFORE, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, and signature by Mayor, this ordinance shall take immediate force and effect.



AN ORDINANCE

Adopting and Amending ordinance No. 2018-64 (Permanent 2019 Appropriations) by decreasing appropriations and appropriating from unappropriated funds in the General Fund, Street Maintenance and Repair Fund, Dare Fund, Infrastructure Capital Improvement Fund, and Storm Water Fund and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Fostoria, Seneca, Hancock, and Wood Counties, Ohio:

SECTION 1: That ordinance No. 2018-64 (Permanent 2019 Appropriations) passed December 18, 2018, be, and the same is hereby amended as delineated in the following sections:

SECTION 2: That Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-120-500135 General Fund/Security of Persons and Property-Fire/Personal Services-Overtime.

SECTION 3: That Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-150-500135 General Fund/Security of Persons and Property-Traffic Signs/Personal Services-Overtime.

SECTION 4: That Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-200-500110 General Fund/Public Health-Cemetery/Personal Services-Full Time Salaries.

SECTION 5: That One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-499-531702 General Fund/Community Environment-Community Development/Contractual Services-CIC Contribution.

SECTION 6: That Six Hundred Dollars (\$600) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-710-500155 General Fund/General Government-Mayor/Personal Services-Workmans Compensation.

SECTION 7: That Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-741-531813 General Fund/General Government-Income Tax/Contractual Services-Tax Fees.

SECTION 8: That One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 101-901-573040 General Fund/Advance Out/Advances Out.

SECTION 9: That Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 201-620-500135 Street Maintenance and Repair Fund/Transportation-Street/Personal Services-Overtime.

SECTION 10: That Fourteen Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$14,700) be appropriated from unappropriated funds to 211-100-561860 Dare Fund/Security of Persons and Property-Police/Other-Refunds.

SECTION 11. That Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) be decreased from funds appropriated to 431-620-559004 Infrastructure Capital Improvement Fund – Transportation-Street/Capital Outlay-Infrastructure.

SECTION 12. That Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) be decreased from funds appropriated to 521-522-559004 Storm Water Fund – Basic Utility-Storm Water/Capital Outlay-Infrastructure.

SECTION 13: That this ordinance shall be published in accordance with applicable Ohio Law.

SECTION 14: It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, and in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.


SECTION 15: That in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City of Fostoria and its inhabitants, and in order to make the appropriation adjustments in the Permanent 2019 appropriations without delay to meet pending obligations, this measure is determined to be an emergency ordinance and shall take effect at the earliest time allowed by law after its passage.

THEREFORE, upon the affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members elected to Council, and signature by Mayor, this ordinance shall take immediate force and effect.
