FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What constitutes a Hat Trick?

<u>All three (3) darts</u> must be in the bullseye; whether they are in a single or double bullseye.

If the game is ended by two (2) bullseyes and the third dart is thrown in the bullseye, is that a Hat Trick?

No. The game ended on the second bullseye. The third dart does not count.

If I throw three (3) single numbers (i.e., 20's, 19's, etc.) can't I just hit 'T' on the tablet?

No. You hit the number (i.e., 20's, 19's, etc.) you threw, three (3) separate times. The same goes for two (2) of the same number and hitting the 'D'; you must hit the number two (2) individual times.

% All bullseyes are equal, right?

- No. The inner/center section of the bullseye is counted as a "double bull" and is worth 50 points. The outer section of the bullseye is counted a "single bull" and is worth 25 points. <u>All inner/center/"double" bullseyes are greater in points than outer/"single" bullseyes. This includes when throwing the Diddle.</u> (See "<u>Diddle</u>" in the SWFDA Rules Book)
- If it's getting close to midnight and it doesn't look like all of the games in a match will be completed, can we chalk the remaining games to get them completed?

Absolutely!

In '01 games, if I throw a dart and believe it is "out" and continue to throw additional darts, then realize the first dart was actually "in", do the subsequent darts count and means I busted?

No. If it is determined and agreed upon by all players in that game, that the first dart thrown was in fact "in", the game is/was immediately over at that point. No subsequent darts count.

If I throw a dart and the flight comes off mid-air and the stem enters the board, does that count?

No. A legal dart must have a single needle-like point in the board.

What happens if I throw a dart in between the wires of a triple, but outside the "paint" of the board?

The wires count, not the "paint".

If I only have three (3) players show up by 8pm, but my 4th player is on their way, the other team has to wait, right?

A: Matches will start by 8:15pm. If a team has at least two (2) rostered players present at 8:15pm, the match will be started. If not, the match will be forfeited. (See "<u>THE MATCH</u>" in the SWFDA Rules Book)

In the third (3rd) week of the season, if we are scheduled to play at our sponsored bar, we are the "home" team, right?

A: Not necessarily. The team with lower team points in their respective Division will be considered the "home" team, <u>regardless of location</u>. (See "<u>THIRD LEG OF</u> <u>SEASON</u>" and 5. and 6. Under <u>THE MATCH</u> in the SWFDA Rules Book)
