
A Holiday Thought

Grandma is going to force-feed everyone who isn't legally obese and it makes you wonder how we survived for three thousand years. No, it's not family.

I doubt it's the food. If people really liked matza that much, they'd eat it during the year. Then there's the traditional chunk of horseradish root dipped in charoset.

Those in the know scoop off and eat the charoset, but when an unsuspecting guest comes and actually takes a bite out of the horseradish itself and chokes and turns purple -- that's fun. But no, I guess it's not the food.

I guess there is a sense of history -- of connecting to something that stretches way beyond the living memory of anyone within living memory. An understanding that we Jews had an experience over 3300 years ago in Egypt that has stayed with us down to our own days. Yet it's curious that Jews who are jettisoning so much of Jewish tradition still cling to some form of a Passover Seder. Why has this ceremony remained more than everything else?

The Sages of the Talmud teach us that when Moshe came to take the Jews out of Egypt, they had by then sunk to the lowest possible level of spirituality. Still they maintained their original Hebrew names, they still spoke ancient Hebrew and they also remained loyal to their spouses.

KIDDUSH DETAILS:

- The Shul will subsidize each week's Kiddush for events other than special Life-Cycle events, such as Bar/Bat Mitzvah, Ufrauf, etc.
- The cost for a member to host a Kiddush is \$60 and the Shul will cover the other half.
- A normal Kiddush consists of whole and chopped herring, crackers, soda, cookies and schnaps for Kiddush. Up to nine tables are set up. If additional tables are needed, check the Kiddush Policy letter for details. Kiddush for a special event or Simcha (Bar Mitzvah, Ufruf, etc.) is not subsidized by the Shul.
- The cost of Shalosh Seudos is \$25.
- Use the Sign-up sheet downstairs to reserve sponsorship for a Kiddush or Shalosh Seudos. A copy of the complete policy governing Kiddush. sponsors and use of the Shul is also posted there.

A Holiday Thought continued

I<mark>n many ways they would seem to have been doing a lot better than many people today.</mark>

But they were only a few generations away from Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. They had contact with prophecy within their grandparents' lifetime. The power of spirituality, to sense G-d, was profound. That made their disconnectedness much more powerful. So when we are told that they were swept into the idolatrous cults of ancient Egypt, it meant that they would not be able to survive as Jews for much longer. The Torah tells us that they left in haste, which the Sages explain means that much longer and they would not have been saved. You can only save something that still exists, once it's all gone, salvation becomes a moot point.

We read in the Passover Haggada, that the prophet Ezekiel says "By your blood you shall live." Ezekiel was referring to the blood of the Passover sacrifice and the blood of circumcision. It was almost as though G-d needed to give them a reason,

some kind of spiritual identity, in order to assert their Jewishness and allow them to be redeemed. Perhaps the symbols involved blood in order to "get the blood flowing" again, in order to allow them to come back to life as Jews.

That experience of thousands of years ago is lodged in our collective subconscious. We remember how close we were to being lost as a people and what it took to bring us back to life. That little voice inside of us saying "I want to connect to my people."

So despite the food, the family dynamics, the hours of preparation -millions of Jews will join together this Passover evening to relive the Passover Seder for the three thousand three hundred and fifteenth time. And in the search for meaning there will be those who will feel their Jewish blood start to flow and they will look for a sense of personal redemption to carry them further up the ladder of spiritual growth.

Chag Sameiach!

A SEDER VORT: Kol Dichfin

The Seder begins with the cryptic phrase: *Kol Dichfin Yesei V'Yeichal; Kol Ditzrich Yesei V'Yifsach*. All who are hungry let them come and eat; all who are in need, let them come and celebrate Pesach. What is the connection of this to the Hagadah? The Gemarah in Taanis (20b) tells us that the Amora Rav Huna used to invite people to his meals this way regularly not only on Pesach. What is it about this phrase that connects it to Pesach Seder?

Ray Soloveitchik provides us with an answer.

This is an expression of *Cherus* (freedom) the status as a free people that we are required to feel. Inviting people to join in a meal helps establish that. Only a free man can invite others to join him for a meal. A slave cannot do that. He does not 'own' a meal that he can invite anyone to. There is a Halachic principle of *Ma SheKoneh Eved, Konah Rabo*. What ever a slave takes possession of - automatically belongs to the master.

The Vilna Gaon adds that there is an element of *Tzedaka* involved here. That of *Moes Chitin*, a Halacha mentioned in Talmud Yerushalmi. By inviting the 'those in need' to a meal one fulfils this Mitzvah. With respect to the second portion of that phrase, there is a Mitzvah to count others into a single *Korban Pesach*. This is called a *Chabura* - Group. The Rambam tells us that even though one may *shecht* and eat the *Korban Pesach* alone - one should avoid this and opt for *shechting* and eating it with a group of neighbors or friends. This is what the second part of the phrase makes reference to. It does not apply to the poor the way the first part of the invitation does. It applies to everyone as a reference to the preferable method of eating the *Korban Pesach* in a *Chabura*.

Ray Solovetchik explains that fourth question of the *Mah Nishtana* is better understood this way. The word Mesubin, which refers to reclining is used in the context of a *Chabura*. That is the way that word is used in a Braisa in *Meseches Brachos* (46b). There it states that one should not sit (*Yaseiv*) in a *Chaburah* of *Amei Ha'aretz*. So here too it is used in that way: *Mesubin* in a *Chabura*.
