

"Flopsy, Mopsy and "

This month we will be using acrylic paint on scalloped landscape edging to create an adorable Easter project you can tuck in amongst your spring bulbs or on your Easter dinner buffet. This piece reminded me of the childhood stories of Flopsy, Mopsy and Cottontail that I heard every year at Easter time. As in most sibling groups, there's always one troublemaker. And here we have Cottontail!

I will have the complete lesson at the meeting but right now we will concentrate on prepping. If your stone has been outside in the weather and is dirty or sandy, wash it well using a scrub brush and let it dry thoroughly. On a nice dry day use a grey spray primer of your choice to prime all 6 sides of your stone. One of the fun surprises about this surface is that you can use the flat side up for one project and then turn it around and upside down and do a different holiday piece on the other side with the scallops on top. (This is why you want to prime all sides before you start painting.) When drying, either after washing with water or priming, you might consider setting your oven for 200°. When preheated, put your stone in and turn off the oven. Leave it overnite in the closed oven to insure it's dry.

I will be teaching this program as a drybrush class on a textured surface. If you choose to paint this pattern on a different surface it is fine with me but you have a choice to make. If you want to do traditional floats for shading and highlighting, then prep your surface as usual to get a nice smooth surface for floating. If, however, you choose to try the drybrushing on a surface other than the stone, you need to get some texture into your primer coat.

There are 3 methods I have used with nice results:

- 1. Use thick, thick paint with a rough bristle brush and slip slap the thick paint in multiple directions around your entire surface. I've not used it but you can also add some texture medium to help make the brush marks more textured. You may have to do this twice to get enough texture.
- 2. Buy Krylon spray texture paint, available at Wal-Mart, and spray all faces of your surface. The spray leaves a dense sandy surface, sort of like really rough sandpaper. This is the method Rosemary West uses and suggests lately.
- 3. Apply acrylic paint with a small textured (not foam) paint roller. Continue rolling all over until your surface is almost completely dry. As it dries, the roller will pull up little nubbies that will give you enough texture for drybrush.

When your priming is finished, continue with prep work as follows:

- Transfer your pattern, except faces, with white Saral transfer paper.
- Basecoats may take more than one coat to completely cover the primer in all the nooks and crannies. You want to cover the primer but don't basecoat so much you have a smooth surface. We want the textured surface so we can drybrush later.
- Basecoat the background behind the bunnies and the entire flat top side with
 Moon Yellow.
- Basecoat Flopsy and Mopsy (Rt and Lt bunnies) with a light grey.
- Basecoat Cottontail (center) with a dark grey.
- Basecoat one flower with Grape Jelly and the other with Razzleberry.
- Basecoat flower centers with Citron Green.

Transfer faces with Saral.

At this point you are ready to come to class. Supplies are as follows:

Paints:

dark grey of your choice light grey of your choice or tint dark with white Moon Yellow DA White Napa DA Razzleberry DA Paynes Grey DA Citron Green DA Cerulean Blue DA Bluegrass Green DA Grape Juice DA Dioxazine Purple DA

<u>Brushes:</u> If you are <u>floating</u>, use your regular acrylic brushes. If you are doing <u>drybrush</u>, I would suggest bristle brushes in domes or filberts. If you have favorite drybrush brushes, use what makes you comfortable. These stones are hard on brushes so do not bring your best delicate brushes. You will need a medium size, #6 or 8, dome or filbert and a #1 or 2 liner brush for detail work. You might want to bring a couple of regular filbert or round brushes for some of the details.




