Dear OLSS Families,

I would like to explain a little bit more about the purpose and expectations of fundraising for our school. Our goal is – and always has been – to provide the highest quality faith-based education for your child. The actual cost to educate a student is much greater than the tuition we charge. The actual cost of tuition is approximately \$10,000/per year, per child. We charge approximately \$7,000, and to bridge that financial gap, we rely on support from our Parish, our HSA, fundraisers, and other advancement efforts each year.

As explained at Back to School night, in several school newsletters, and again at the recent HSA meeting that there would be many more small fundraisers this year due to the restrictions we are under due to COVID. Our usual larger fundraising events such as the Christmas Bazaar, Fr. Alexander Gala, Spaghetti Dinner, Spring Tea Party, and many other events have had to be cancelled. We usually only need to have one major fundraiser in the fall and one in the spring, but since we cannot have many traditional events, we must try to make up for that by having several smaller fundraisers.

I also mentioned that families are required to participate in some fundraising events, but I do not want them to feel pressured to participate in all of them. I suggested choosing one and participating as fully as possible and passing on others. I try to make it fun and show my appreciation to families for their efforts by offering incentives to the students for their participation. For the current SchoolStore.com fundraiser, you don't even need to sell or buy anything; all you have to do is register, and every child gets a prize.

I can assure you that there is no pressure here at school from teachers regarding fundraising. Please do not put that pressure on yourselves or your children. Since every family is required to participate in fundraising, then every child will receive an incentive at some point in time. No one gets them all and it is not expected. Some families are able to give more volunteer time than others; some rely on the fundraising to meet their obligation. I am trying to provide opportunities to help everyone meet their volunteer service hours and fundraising goals.

I hope this has helped to further explain the fundraising. I am very appreciative of all that you do to support OLSS.

Each class is participating in an service project to support local charities for the Advent Season:


- PK-1st: Project Echo Homeless Shelter
