**SUBJECT:** Cyber Liability Insurance Policy - FY2025

Cyber liability coverage protects the LTTO and its Member Districts if there is an unauthorized release of private/confidential information, copyright/trademark violation allegations, and computer security compromises. The coverage provides defense costs in the event of state or Federal regulatory proceedings in the event of privacy law violations, expert resources, and monetary reimbursement for the expenses related to handling these types of incidents.

The current policy limits liability coverage up to \$3 million, with a period of restoration of 365 days. Additionally, the coverage includes offline media.

The quoted premium for the policy for FY2025 is \$5,853.00, a \$183.00 premium increase from the current fiscal year (FY2024: \$5,670.00).

8 ~~Range 13 East~~. After the April 5, 2011 consolidated election,  
9 the trustees of schools in Township 36 North, Range 13 East  
10 shall no longer be elected pursuant to the provisions of  
11 Sections 5-2, 5-2.1, 5-3, 5-4, 5-12, and 5-13 of this Code. Any  
12 such trustees elected before such date may complete the term  
13 to which that trustee was elected, but shall not be succeeded  
14 by election. Instead, the board of education or board of  
15 school directors of each of the elementary and high school  
16 districts that are subject to the jurisdiction of Township 36

6 on or before April 4, 2023 may complete the term to which that  
7 trustee was trustees elected or appointed, but may not be  
8 succeeded by election. Each school board of each school  
9 district that is a part of a Class II county school unit shall  
10 appoint one member of the school board or one school employee  
11 to serve as trustee of schools of the township in which such  
12 school district is located. The trustees of schools shall be  
13 appointed by each school board within 60 days after the  
14 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 103rd General  
15 Assembly and shall reorganize within 30 days after all the  
16 trustees of schools have been appointed or within 90 days

23 A majority of members of the trustees of schools shall  
24 constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The  
25 trustees shall organize by appointing one of their number  
26 president, who shall hold the office for 2 years. If the

1 president is absent from any meeting, or refuses to perform  
2 any of the duties of the office, a president pro-tempore may be  
3 appointed. Trustees who serve on the board as a result of  
4 appointment or election at the time of the reorganization  
5 shall continue to serve as a member of the trustees of schools,  
6 with no greater or lesser authority than any other trustee,  
7 until such time as their elected term expires.

8 Each trustee of schools appointed by a board of education  
9 or board of school directors shall be entitled to  
10 indemnification and protection against claims and suits by the  
11 board that appointed that trustee of schools for acts or  
12 omissions as a trustee of schools in the same manner and to the  
13 same extent as the trustee of schools is entitled to  
14 indemnification and protection for acts or omissions as a  
15 member of the board of education or board of school directors  
16 under Section 10-20.20 of this Code.

24 township, no 2 trustees shall reside, when elected, in the  
25 same school district; except that in townships in which at

1 least 90% of the electors reside in one school district which

3 that township, this restriction shall not apply. No person  
4 shall be eligible to the office of trustee of schools and  
5 school director or school board member at the same time.

6 This Section does not apply to trustees appointed under

17 the law requires that there be school trustees, the election  
18 of trustees of schools shall be held at the same time.

19 No person shall be nominated for the office of trustee of  
20 schools, in townships containing 20,000 inhabitants or over,  
21 except by petition signed by at least 5% or 500 of the voters  
22 of the school township in which the person is seeking  
23 nomination and election who last cast votes in the most recent  
24 election, whichever is less, filed with the township  
25 treasurer, or, in case of a first election, with the county

1 clerk.

2 A candidate for election as a school trustee, who has  
3 petitioned for nomination to fill a full term and to fill a  
4 vacant term to be voted upon at the same election, must  
5 withdraw his or her petition for nomination from either the  
6 full term or the vacant term by written declaration, which  
7 shall be signed and acknowledged by an officer authorized to  
8 take such acknowledgments and which is filed with the township  
9 treasurer in the township in which he or she is a candidate  
10 within the time provided by the general election law.

24 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (b) and

1 (c), in Class II county school units the trustees of schools  
2 shall appoint a treasurer who shall be ex-officio clerk of the  
3 board. The term of the township treasurer shall be for a 2 year  
4 period beginning and ending on the first of July. The  
5 treasurer shall ~~be a resident of the township, but~~ not be a  
6 trustee, or school board member. He shall attend all meetings  
7 and keep a record of the official proceedings of the trustees  
8 of schools. Such record shall be open to public inspection.  
9 All proceedings, when recorded, shall be signed by the  
10 president and the clerk. If the clerk is absent, or refuses to  
11 perform any of his duties, a clerk pro tempore may be  
12 appointed. For sufficient cause the treasurer may be removed  
13 from office by the trustees of schools. In case of a vacancy  
14 the trustees of schools shall elect a treasurer for the

16 (b) In Class I county school units, and in each school  
17 district which forms a part of a Class II county school unit  
18 but which has withdrawn from the jurisdiction and authority of  
19 the trustees of schools of the township in which such school

23 shall either elect one of its members to serve as treasurer

1 An appointed treasurer shall serve at the pleasure of the  
2 board. An appointed treasurer shall be at least 21 years of  
3 age, of approved integrity, but not a member of the county  
4 board of school trustees. The records of the treasurer shall  
5 be open to public inspection. Two or more such districts may  
6 appoint the same treasurer. In case of a vacancy caused by the  
7 death, resignation or the removal from office of the school  
8 treasurer the school board shall appoint a treasurer. The  
9 school board may determine the temporary incapacity of its  
10 treasurer occasioned by illness, absence from the district or  
11 any other cause which prevents the prompt performance of his  
12 duties and appoint an acting treasurer to serve until the  
13 board determines such temporary incapacity no longer exists.

14 (c) The school board of each elementary school, high  
15 school and unit school district that forms a part of a Class II  
16 county school unit and that was under the jurisdiction and  
17 authority of the township treasurer and trustees of schools of  
18 a township at the time those offices were abolished in that  
19 township as provided in subsection (c) of Section 5-1 shall  
20 appoint a person to serve as treasurer of the school board. The  
21 term of each school treasurer appointed under this subsection  
22 shall be for a 2 year period beginning and ending on the first  
23 day of July. A person appointed under this subsection to serve  
24 as treasurer of a school board shall not be the superintendent  
25 of schools of the school district. A person appointed and  
26 serving under this subsection as treasurer of a school board

1 may concurrently serve as the treasurer of the regional board  
2 of school trustees, if selected to serve in that capacity by  
3 the regional board of school trustees, as provided in  
4 subsection (c) of Section 5-1. The school board shall fix the  
5 compensation of its school treasurer, and for sufficient cause  
6 may remove the school treasurer from office. However, if a  
7 member of the school board is also school treasurer, he or she  
8 shall perform his or her duties as school treasurer without  
9 compensation. In the case of a vacancy, the school board shall  
10 appoint a school treasurer for the unexpired term. The school  
11 board may determine the temporary incapacity of its treasurer  
12 due to illness, absence from the district, or other cause that  
13 prevents the prompt performance of his duties and may appoint  
14 an acting treasurer to serve until the school board determines  
15 that the temporary incapacity of its treasurer no longer  
16 exists.

17 (d) After October 1, 1977, each treasurer in a Class I  
18 county school unit appointed under this Section for his first  
19 term shall have a financial background or related experience  
20 or 12 semester hours of credit of college level accounting.

21 (e) After August 14, 1989, any treasurer appointed under  
22 this Section for his first term in Class II county school  
23 units, including any person appointed by a school board to  
24 serve as its treasurer as provided in subsection (c) of this  
25 Section, shall be a certified public accountant or a certified  
26 chief school business official as defined in part (3) of



1 Section 21-7.3 of this Act. Experience as a township treasurer  
2 in a Class II county school unit prior to July 1, 1989 shall be  
3 deemed the equivalent of certification.

4 (f) Concurrently with the election or appointment of its  
5 own school treasurer by the school board of a school district  
6 which forms a part of a Class II county school unit but which  
7 no longer is subject to the jurisdiction and authority of a  
8 township treasurer or trustees of schools of a township  
9 because the district has withdrawn from the jurisdiction and  
10 authority of the township treasurer and trustees of schools of  
11 the township or because those offices have been abolished as  
12 provided in subsection (b) or (c) of Section 5-1, all funds,  
13 accounts, moneys, notes, bonds, mortgages and effects then  
14 held by such township treasurer on behalf or for the use and  
15 benefit of, or then credited by such township treasurer to any  
16 fund or account of such school district shall thereupon be  
17 transferred and paid over by such township treasurer to the  
18 school treasurer elected or appointed by the school board of  
19 such school district. In addition the school treasurer of such  
20 school district shall have the right, at all reasonable times,  
21 to inspect all cash books, loan books, district account books  
22 and journals kept by such township treasurer as provided in  
23 Section 8-5 and to copy or otherwise reproduce such portions  
24 thereof as such school treasurer deems necessary for the  
25 performance of his duties.

26 (g) Upon the abolition of the offices of the township

1 treasurer and trustee of schools of a township as provided in  
2 subsection (c) of Section 5-1, and subject to the limitation  
3 of subsection (b) of Section 8-5 with respect to certain  
4 records to be surrendered to the regional board of school  
5 trustees, and except as otherwise provided in subsection (c)  
6 of Section 5-1 with respect to the common school lands and  
7 township loanable funds of that township and with respect to  
8 the records, books and accounts relating to those common  
9 school lands and township loanable funds, all school funds and  
10 accounts, moneys, notes, bonds, securities, district account  
11 books and other documents, records and effects then held by  
12 the former township treasurer on behalf or for the use and  
13 benefit of, or then credited by the former township treasurer  
14 to any fund or account of any school district that was under  
15 the jurisdiction and authority of the township treasurer at  
16 the time the office of that township treasurer was abolished  
17 shall thereupon be transferred and paid over by the former  
18 township treasurer to the appropriate school treasurer  
19 appointed by the school board of each such district under  
20 subsection (c) of this Section 8-1.

21 (h) If the school district of a school treasurer elected  
22 or appointed under this Section is receiving emergency State  
23 financial assistance under Article 1B, that school treasurer  
24 is subject to the provisions of Article 1B.
