A Note from Rick: Markets steady to stronger at TLA this week. One of the markets that stood out to me this week was the Hay market on Tuesday. As we continue to get into the season for a more active hay market, I wonder if Tuesday's hay sale won't be an example of what we'll see all winter. The majority of the hay, and I mean majority, was of excellent quality and sold for \$200-\$300/ton. Calf numbers were up this week and prices were steady from \$1.00 to \$1.20. Slaughter cattle prices were steady as well, while slaughter cows were a little softer again this week. Thursday's Springer Auction brought a price increase of \$100-\$150 on the majority of the cattle. We had right at 200 head of heifers and a very active market throughout the sale. This doesn't come as a big surprise to me with the number of replacements on the market continuing to decline. The Draft Horse and Friesian Fall Classic catalogs have been mailed and should be in the homes of our consignors and buyers from the last three sales. If you have not received one, stop by the office and grab one. I think that you will see that there are many quality horses that will be brought through the ring in the next few weeks. Our committee members and employees have put in countless hours to ensure that TLA is ready. See you at TLA!
