


Pet of the Month

WASSAIL is a traditional old English beverage enjoyed around the holidays! A spicy, fruity variation on Hot Apple Cider, it is often to be found served at parties and family gatherings, frequently adorned with decorative fruits, festively and artistically cut, bobbing about in it.

Fruit Juices:

4 parts Apple Cider2 parts Orange Juice1 part Pineapple JuiceA few squeezes of Lemon Juice

Spices (add to taste):

Whole Cloves (for floaters)
Cinnamon Sticks (for floaters)
Star Anise (for floaters)
Brown Sugar
Ground Cinnamon
Allspice
Ginger
Nutmeg

Optional Decorative Fruit Floaters:

Orange Slices/Wedges/Peels, and/or Apple Slices/Wedges/Peels, and/or Lemon Slices/Wedges/Peels, and/or Pineapple Slices, and/or Cranberries. Poke into Above Floaters: Cinnamon Sticks, Cloves, Anise Stars, Raisins Heat to steaming. Serve Hot!

*if making "Red Wassail" add 1 or 2 parts Cranberry Juice
