DIAL-A-PRIEST!

Jeremiah 31: 7-9; Psalm 126: 1-6; Heb. 5: 1-6; Mark 10: 45-52

What do you want Jesus to do for you? Ask Him in faith through His priests!

"The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy." Indeed, the Lord has done great things for you and me by sending His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, to offer Himself as an eternal sacrifice for our salvation. On this Priesthood Sunday, the scripture readings draw attention to the sacred priesthood and emphasize the importance of the presence of a priest amongst God's people.

The first reading from the Book of the Prophet Jeremiah echoes optimism of the chosen people of God. Its background is the long-awaited homecoming of the Babylonian Exiles. Jeremiah's mission was to bring hope to the despondent people of God: "Shout with joy for Jacob, exult at the head of the nations; proclaim your praise and say: The Lord has delivered His people, the remnant of Israel..." He, the Lord, "will gather them from the ends of the world, with the blind and the lame in their midst..." Even though the Israelites had sinned and wondered away from God, He never abandoned them. The Lord is always true to His covenant. Prophet Jeremiah never lost trust in God that He would one day heal the wounds of His beloved people, rebuild their nation and restore their pride. The Lord is always willing to do great things for those who trust in Him.

In confirming the important role of prophets / priests amongst God's people, the Letter to the Hebrews says, "Every high priest is taken from among men and made their representative before God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins." The Mystery of the Incarnation, God becoming man, reveals that Christ, our High Priest, was chosen amongst men to offer Himself as a sacrificial Lamb. Similarly, your parish priest is taken from amongst your midst, ordained and sent to empathize and sympathize with you in times of pain and sorrow. He is there to pray for you and with you. He is chosen to comfort the broken hearted and to bring healing to the sick. The priest is present in your midst to bring hope to the hopeless - light to those in darkness - support to the afflicted.

The essential element of the priesthood is to choose men who are *alter christus* (another Christ) to offer sacrifice to God on behalf of God's people - to be servants of God in service to His people - mediators between God and man. A priest's role is to intervene and intercede with God on the people's behalf. God communicates His love and care to His people through His priests. He sends them to administer the Sacraments and to preach the Gospel to you and me - to reconcile us with God and one another - to witness to His compassion and love - to invoke God's blessing upon us. The priests are "taken from among men," therefore, like all men, they are human, deficient, but God's own instruments. God's power is made perfect even in the weaknesses of His priests.

In today's gospel we read of the blind man, Bartimaeus, who called out to Jesus for help, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." He looked beyond the humanness of Jesus; thus, he sought for help that resulted in him being healed by Jesus. Like Bartimaeus, you and I must "throw aside our cloaks" of doubts - multiple excuses - laziness - selfishness - self-worthlessness; so that we can be freer to come to Jesus who is always ready and willing to heal us through the sacraments administered by His holy priests.
