
e have a friend in the palace. We shall see the downfall of our enemies. G-d is controlling events behind the scenes. Everything can change in a moment. These central lessons of Purim inspire us each year as we read of the great miracle done for us in those days, and our joy carries over to our sharing mishloach manis, charity, and a festive meal with

food and much wine. On this holiday more than any other drinking to intoxication has become part of regular observance. Yet why should that be? Why should getting drunk be a mitzvah at all, let alone to the point of fulfilling the dictum found in the Babylonian Talmud:

"One is obligated on Purim to a drunkenness so stout that one is unable to differentiate between the blessed Mordechai and the accursed Haman"! Such wild reveling seems out of step with the Jewish way of joyous yet sanctified celebration.

In these fortunate time, regardless of one's political views we know that we have many friends in "the palace". Even before the new administration entered The White House the Jewish presence and influence in United States politics has never been greater, and our State of Israel has never been so secure. Many of our enemies are tied up with internal concerns or have become allies. It has never been easier to have faith that G-d is controlling events to our favor. We have seen sudden change, how in just days in 1967 our State of Israel went from the threat of destruction to long-term viability.

Now place yourself in Babylonia/Iraq in the fifth century. You are one minority among many, with no special influence in the halls of power. The



land of Israel is in decline as a center for the Jewish People, who are still building a diaspora-based Jewish consciousness. All hope of a renewal of sovereignty in Israel are dashed, haunted still by the disastrous failure of Bar Kochba. G-d has exiled us and we can only

wait for a redemption that will almost certainly not come in my lifetime. For this Babylonian Jew the promise of Purim seems so remote.

In Babylon, in the ghetto, in the shtetl and for the 1,800 years from Bar Kochba until modern Zionism, how could we feel hope against all appearances? Why, you would have to be drunk to believe!

We are so Blessed to live in a time when the almost unbelievable is now the almost undeniable.

THE CANTOR'S CLOUD by Cantor Menachem Bazian The Day After Tomorrow

esterday, I walked outside without a jacket, basking in the deliciously warm sunshine of an unusually warm February day it was glorious. The sky was blue and I could almost feel the promise of an early spring in the air.

Today, I am sitting at my desk at home. The district is closed and my space heater is going full blast as snowpocalypse reigns supreme outside. The forecast is for over a foot of snow which, as soon as I am done with this article, Chana and I will have to shovel.

What a difference a day makes, eh?

This radical change between two days got me thinking at how quickly our circumstances can change. One moment we can be flying atop the world and the next moment it can come crashing down. Take Haman, for example. One day he is invited to a dinner party by the queen. He was pretty happy about that. "And Haman left that day happy and with a light heart," the Megilla tells us. He was on top of the world.

When you think about it, he had good reason to be happy. He had successfully convinced the king to exterminate an entire race within his kingdom. He did a masterful job of slandering the Jewish people and convincing the king that the Jews in the Persian kingdom were not only subversive but also worthless. As the Talmud tells us (TractateMegilla, Page 13b), Haman's statement covered all of the King's potential arguments. Here's what Haman said to the King:

"There is a certain people, scattered and dispersed among the other peoples in all the provinces of your realm, whose laws are different from those of any other people and who do not obey the king's laws; and it is not in Your Majesty's interest to tolerate them." meant that their population won't be missed. Their laws are different meant that they won't eat with us or marry us. They do



not obey the king's laws meant that they are always idle saying it's Shabbat or a holiday. That's a lot of slander in just a simple statement.

So, from Haman's perspective, he was having a pretty good couple of days. The king is in his pocket, the queen is inviting him to parties without any other member of the nobility, and the hated Jews are headed for the chopping block. Not bad for a few days work, no?

Well, within 24 hours it was all over. Instead of riding high, he was hanging high on a 75 foot gallows and his plans were toast.

History is rife with similar examples. During World War II, for example, many military historians believe that Germany was inches away from winning the war. Somehow, at a few critical moments, decisions were made by the Nazi dictator (whose name I will not mention; I'll just refer to him as the dictator of Germany or DOG) that immolated his chances at world domination. During the battle of Dunkirk, he stopped his assault for a crucial few days thus allowing the British Expeditionary Force to escape. Had the Germans destroyed the BEF, Britain may have been knocked out of the war right there. The battle for Russia would have been a one front war with quite likely a different outcome.

During the battle for Russia, DOG diverted troops from the push to Moscow in a maneuver that many consider to have been futile. The German attack was stopped about 11 miles short of the Kremlin. Without that diversion,

Germany takes Moscow and quite possibly wins the war against Russia right there.

Finally, DOG did not have to declare war on the United States. When congress declared war on December 7, 1941, it was only against Japan. Had DOG not declared war, Roosevelt would not have been able to do so against Germany in 1941. Without the United States in the war in Europe, that could have put a dent or even an end to Lend Lease and that could have tipped the war to Germany.

I am frequently amazed at how much can happen in one moment of time. We make decisions that can set off a sequence of events that can change our entire lives. That's why our sages teach us (Tractate Tamid, 32a), "Who is wise? He who sees what is about to come to pass." Our sages tell us that the essence of wisdom is to think things through and see what can come of our actions and decisions because life, and sometimes even the world, can change in just one instant.

It is, perhaps, ironic that I see two radically opposite lessons in this single truism of life. If life can turn on a dime, it is incumbent upon us to make the most of each moment. Hashem has given us a limited amount of time on this earth. It is up to us to use that time wisely and not to squander it. Our motto in life should be carpe diem, seize the day. We should look for every opportunity to learn more, do more, love more, and experience more. We waste too much time on silliness and not enough time on what matters. We spend too much time at work and not enough at home or at play; too much time criticizing and not enough enjoying; too much time gathering and not enough time sharing. Life has so much to offer us if we just reach out and grab it when we can.

Part of the beauty of being traditional Jews is that we are part of a people that understands this. We know that each opportunity to do a *Mitzvah*, to learn *Torah*, and to spend time with our spouses, children and grandchildren is precious and cannot be overlooked. We have only this time to fill our lives with good, and we have to make the most of it.

On the other hand, if every decision we make can have such far reaching consequences, we have to bear the future in mind too. Life cannot just be about right now. Sometimes we will have to think and choose our actions, our words, our decisions very carefully. Being Jewish is about understanding that there is a future and, while the world is in *Hashem's* hands, we have to do our part as well. So, we should do our best to protect our loved ones, to forgive them as we would want to be forgiven, to foment brotherhood amongst ourselves by keeping the simple thought in our minds that what we do or say today can have great effect on the future.

Live in the moment, but always consider the future.

Chana and I would like to wish you all a Happy Purim!

P.S. Shaarey Israel is planning some really great events for Purim. Invite your kids and grandchildren to join us for what will no doubt be an incredibly fun time. See you there!

As we have done in the past, we are urging all of our members and friends, to remember the Holocaust by purchasing and lighting the Yellow, Yahrzeit, Yom HaShoah Candles. This day is known as "Holocaust Remembrance Day" to commemorate the lives and heroism of the six million Jewish people who were murdered in the Holocaust between 1933 and 1945 as well as the five million others who perished in the Holocaust. The money that we receive from your purchase of the Yom HaShoah Yellow Candles gets divided up so that a portion goes to the Synagogue, a portion goes the Hebrew School, and a portion gets donated back to the Holocaust Center, to further their educational programs. It's an important job and you can help by purchasing a Yellow Candle. We are hoping for one hundred percent participation for this worthwhile project. The Yom HaShoah Memorial Service Celebration falls on the 27th day of Nissan, the first month of the Jewish year. It is customary to light a Yahrzeit candle and recite the Kaddish, for those who died. This year it is marked on the evening of Sunday April 23rd and is observed on the day of April 24th 2017. We wish all families to "Light a Candle, Preserve a Memory".

We want your opinions and input on the programs we are contemplating for the upcoming months. We will be able to do exciting and dynamic programs only if your input can be heard. Get in touch with members of the Men's Club or better yet, come down and express your ideas and a way of helping. We schedule Men's Club Board Meetings on the first Tuesday of each month, and we encourage you to come down, and join us, as we plan out these upcoming events. The March meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 7th, 2017. We invite all the men of the congregation to come down to help us plan and join us. We welcome your ideas, and suggestions.



THE ALEPH BETS OF HEBREW by Bill Bradin

Hebrew is not such a difficult egg to crack. Each month, I plan to try and define Hebrew words and expressions that we commonly use in our daily vernacular.

his month we welcome the Hebrew month of Adar. You know what that means; Purim is right around the corner. One of the mitzvot of Purim is to partake in a SE'UDAH. So, let's take a look at the word se'udah.

The word **se'udah** simply means "feast, banquet, or meal". The root of the word (**samechayin-daled**). **Se'udah** is derived from the infinitive **Lis'od** and means "to dine". We need to differentiate the word **se'udah** from **arucha**. A **se'udah** is a much bigger and more serious meal than **arucha** (breakfast – lunch – dinner). We typically use **se'udah** when speaking about Shabbat, Holiday/Festival, or a big celebration. We often use the word **se'udah** when eating a big meal in a restaurant. As a matter of fact, the word for restaurant is **mees'adah** and is derived from the same root (**samech-ayin-daled**).

On Shabbat, we eat 3 meals. We eat the Friday evening meal after services, we eat a bigger lunch; with cholent (chamin), and then we eat our third meal between Shabbat Mincha and Ma'ariv at the conclusion of Shabbat. We refer to the third meal by a few different names:

(1) **Shlosh Se'udot** – which really means 3 meals. Please notice that **se'udah** takes on its plural form.

(2) In Ashkenazit, we call the third meal **Shasash Soodis** – which just a variation of number (1).

(3) **Se'udah Shlishit** – which in Hebrew means the 3rd meal and happens to be my personal preference. This version leaves the noun **se'udah** in its singular and feminine form and adds the **shlishi** to it. We are all familiar with the word **shlishi** because the third Aliya to the Torah (after the Cohen & the Levi) is **shlishi**. In the case of **se'udah**; because it is a feminine word it picks up the additional "**t**" (**taf**) at the end of the word.

Pertaining to Purim, there are four Mitzvot that we are commanded to fulfill. The first to to hear the reading of the Megillah, the second is to hand out Mishloach Manot so that those not so fortunate can put together a meal. The third is to give alms to the poor so that those not so fortunate can have a **se'udah**. The forth Mitzvah is to actually eat at a **Se'udat Purim** (a Purim feast).

Se'udat Purim is an example of two nouns working together. In Hebrew the 2nd noun modifies the first. When the 1st of the two nouns is feminine and ends with a hay. The hay converts to a taf to connect between the two.

Bottom line **se'udah** with slight variations means the same thing. Here's to a Happy Purim and wishing everyone the opportunity **lis'od** at a **Se'udat Purim** this year and every year going forward.






