It is never our intent to make families gets rid of their family pets, but rather to work on making sure no future unwanted pregnancies reoccur.						
To that end, we have developed our "Foster to Adopt Puppy Program." When we adopt out a puppy that has not yet been spayed or neutered, the adopter will complete our Foster to Adopt Agreement, a Spay/Neuter Contract, complete our Adoption Contract and the pay the adoption fee in full. The puppy will remain the property of Last Call K9 Rescue until such time as the puppy is spayed or neutered.
